As a peer to many athletes who use this path to get to places to do rides for fitness and training, I know most of them certainly own lights, but there are often times where these individuals get caught out without them. I know from personal experience that situations arise where training rides become longer due to unforeseen circumstances or daylight leaves sooner than expected. Even the most responsible, seasoned cyclist can be left without a light in these situations. This is one of the main reasons I feel it is good to have lights on this path. It is about more than just owning lights for your bike. It is about providing a safe path to ride on when conditions and circumstances are less than ideal.
