## **Multi-Day Events**

The following parks have been designated as suitable sites for multi-day events and/or programming:

- Demetral
- Elver\*
- Olin
- Reindahl
- Vilas
- Warner\*

Please SUBSTANTIALLY reduce the event's number of days, hours of operation, volume of amplification and alcohol sales.

If the sponsors want to have such a big festival perhaps they should move it to a Park that is more appropriate like Central Park, just a few blocks away.
