SUBJECT: 2013 2nd Quarter Traffic Enforcement Activity Report

The information provided in this document represents the Madison Police Department's traffic enforcement activity for **April - June, 2013**.

M.P.D. Traffic Citations

The Madison Police Department issued **6,315** traffic citations (**3,845**) citations were for hazardous violations and **2,470** citations were for non-hazardous violations, in the 2nd quarter of 2013.

This compares to 7,025 total citations issued in the 2nd quarter of 2012. 4,565 of these were hazardous and 2,460 were non hazardous.

It is unclear as to why a reduction of 710 citations issued for 2^{nd} quarter 2013 occurred as compared to 2^{nd} quarter 2012. One contributing factor may have been an unseasonable cooler and rainy weather period during this time that caused drivers to drive slower and more careful. This unseasonable weather may have also impacted efforts to conduct traffic enforcement as compared to previous years.

Traffic Enforcement Safety Team Citations (T.E.S.T.)

Of the **6,315** total citations issued, **2,248** citations (**1,275** hazardous) and (**973** non-hazardous) were issued by the Traffic Enforcement Safety Team. These numbers compare to **2,456** total citations issued by the TEST in 2012, **1,724** of these were hazardous and **732** were non hazardous.

M.P.D. Speeding Citations Issued

During the 2nd quarter of 2013 citations for speeding issued department wide totaled **2,249**. This compares with the **2,465** citations issued in the 2nd quarter of 2012.

Impaired Driving Citations Issued

During the 2nd quarter of 2013 **136** citations were issued for OMVWI. This compares with **148** OMVWI citations being issued in 2012.

Traffic Complaint Hotline

The Traffic Complaint Hotline (previously known as the Speeders Hotline) received **287** citizen calls during the 2nd quarter of 2013. **92** warning letters were sent as a result of reported violations.

School Zones

School zones violation reports from Crossing Guards resulted in 22 warning letters and 55 citations being issued in the 2nd quarter of 2013.

Traffic Enforcement/Safety Grants

63 traffic enforcement overtime grant initiatives were scheduled for the 2nd quarter of 2013. These were coordinated through the Department of Transportation, Bureau of Transportation Safety. The grant initiatives focused on impaired driver (OMVWI), excessive speed, and seat belt enforcement. In addition, the Madison Police Department participated in a multijurisdictional grant sponsored by the State of Wisconsin and administered by the Dane County Sheriff's Department which focused on enforcement of traffic violations in and along the beltline corridor. These grant initiatives resulted in **1,813** citations. During the 2^{nd} quarter we were informed by WIDOT of the following Traffic Enforcement Grant suspensions:

Seat Belt Enforcement:	Suspended as of June 19, 2013.
Speed Enforcement:	Suspended as of July 8 th , 2013.
SMART:	Suspended as of July 19 th , 2013

These grants played a significant part in our ability to dedicate officers for the sole purpose of traffic enforcement. The lack of these grants will have a substantial impact on traffic enforcement and citations issued during the remainder of 2013.

On June, 29th MPD participated in the first Capital Area OWI Task Force grant. This is a multi jurisdictional OWI enforcement effort. The June 29^{th} grant took place in the City of Stoughton. There will be a total of 9 of these efforts on going in 2013.

Significant Crashes

In the 2nd quarter 2013, Traffic Specialists investigated 6 significant traffic crashes. These crashes resulted in 2 deaths. Of these 6 serious crashes, none of the victims were a occupant of a car or truck. 3 were pedestrians, 2 were motorcycles, and 1 was a bicycle.

During 2013 the officers and supervisors of Madison Police Department will continue to work diligently at making Madison's streets safer through education and enforcement.
