An increase in Municipal Court fees from \$28 to \$38 is likely to be authorized by the state and will result in additional revenues of about \$240,000. An ordinance change to raise the fee is expected to be introduced to the Council on October 29, 2013. Current City of Madison levy support for the court is \$90,157. There is no requirement that excess court fee revenue be applied to the Municipal Court, though the spirit of the state law suggests it should be. Additionally, the Municipal Court currently does not have a program for juveniles who need more supervised assistance and supervision. A program such as that does exist for the Circuit Court. \$32,000 is provided to issue a RFP for a pilot program to provide youth support services for the Municipal Court, to be issued by the Community Development Division (CDD) and the Municipal Court Judge. It is anticipated that in 2015, a permanent program will be established and funded with Municipal Court fee revenues. Programs related to the Municipal Court will be considered for the remainder of that funding in 2015 and beyond; costs to run the Court will increase with time and thus the available funds from the fees will decrease.
