MEADOWRIDGE EXPANSION

We had our final public meeting on the current set of drawings for the project. It was well attended and we received some good feedback. The community is really excited about the new library. The RFP for construction will be going out early November. In addition we have received tentative approval to increase the teen librarian position from 80% to a 100% position. We realized that our best chances for the type of teen services we were seeking was to make it a full time position.

PINNEY PROJECT

The proposed Pinney relocation project has been selected as a featured project at the Library Design Institute in St. Louis. OPN is the architectural group that will be working on the project at the Institute. OPN did make a visit to Pinney and also toured several of our other libraries. OPN and a library group also met with the Royster Corners developers.
