This chart takes the license definitions proposed by the alcohol license and business development staff report and re-interprets them to function as land use regulations.

- The first column contains the existing definitions in the zoning code, and any proposed changes or new definitions needed to accomplish the recommendations made by the alcohol license and business development staff report.
- The second column indicates which category from the alcohol beverage license definitions chart would correspond to the defined land use in the zoning code.
- The third column includes notes or questions for policy discussion.
- The fourth column proposes new supplemental regulations for the land use.
- The final column presents a discussion point on whether the use should be a permitted use or a conditional use, and in what districts it should be either, or prohibited.
