We would like to show our support for the RNA's University Avenue Corridor (UAC) plan. As you may know, Lombardino's has become a favored neighborhood as well as destination restaurant. Having our neighborhood support us as much as they do is amazing to see as business owners. Their support is pivotal to our success and for that we thank them every day.

We have another side to our business, the destination restaurant side. In being a destination business, congestion and parking are significant issues for us. Future development of the neighborhood should hinge on trying to make more parking available while building healthy, vibrant commerce.
