Project Description:

As part of the Marquette Neighborhood Association Art Initiatives, we are planning to install 2-3 murals on sides of the Plan B bar on Williamson St. This initiative is similar to the one at the Williamson St Coop in the 1200 block, in that it is a public / private initiative that will enhance the urban environment of the Willy St area while continuing to bring vibrancy to this historic district. The first, most visible mural along Plan B's parking lot will be by Michael Owen of Baltimore. Funding for this mural has been secured from the Madison Community Foundation and from the Madison Art Commission. The opposite side of the building will host a mural by local artist Craig Grabhorn. Plans are not firm for the back wall along the bike path - the 2 murals might reach around to the back, or a third muralist might be brought in -Jennika Bastian, a very talented UW student, who would be enlisted for that. No part of any of the murals will in any way advertise what happens in the businesses inside - with Michael Owen's mural replicating his famed "LOVE" murals in Baltimore and Craig Grabhorn's mural also having up-lifting colors and quite possibly a "broken /mended hearts" theme. Jennika is a master of contemporary portraiture, so her contribution would be in that area. All 3 artists have agreed to work with local youth, and we are particularly focusing on providing an opportunity for LGBT youth to participate in the project. Sharon Kilfoy, co-chair of the Marquette Neighborhood Association Arts Initiative and director of the Williamson St Art Center is coordinating all mural activities.


