RE: Approval of a demolition permit and conditional use to allow an existing gas station and convenience store to be demolished and a new gas station and convenience store to be constructed at 721 S. Gammon Road (Woodman's Food Market, Inc.).

Dear Mr. Arneson;

At its April 28, 2014 meeting, the Plan Commission found the standards met and **approved** your client's demolition permit and conditional use to allow construction of a new gas station and convenience store at 721 S. Gammon Road. The conditions of approval in the following sections shall be satisfied prior to issuance of demolition or building permits for the project.

Please contact Janet Schmidt of the City Engineering Division at 261-9688 if you have questions regarding the following twelve (12) items:

- 1. The new Woodman's gas station will reuse their address of 721 S. Gammon Road.
- 2. The existing building does not have sanitary sewer and the new building appears to have bathrooms. Applicant shall provide a plan showing how the new building will be provided sanitary sewer service.
- 3. All work in the public right-of-way shall be performed by a City licensed contractor.
- 4. All damage to the pavement on S. Gammon Road adjacent to this development shall be restored in accordance with the City of Madison's Pavement Patching Criteria.
- 5. The applicant shall demonstrate compliance with Section 37.07 and 37.08 of Madison General Ordinances regarding permissible soil loss rates. The erosion control plan shall include Universal Soil Loss Equation (USLE) computations for the construction period. Measures shall be implemented in order to maintain a soil loss rate below 7.5-tons per acre per year.
- 6. For Commercial sites less than 1 acre in disturbance, the City of Madison is an approved agent of the Wisconsin Department of Commerce and Wisconsin Department of Natural Resources. As this project is on a site with disturbance area less than 1 acre and contains a commercial building, the City of Madison is authorized to review infiltration, stormwater management, and erosion control

on behalf of the Department of Commerce. No separate submittal to Commerce or the WDNR is required.

- 7. Prior to approval, this project shall comply with Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances regarding stormwater management. Specifically, this development is required to control 40% TSS (20 micron particle) off of new paved surfaces; provide oil & grease control from the first 1/2" of runoff from parking areas, and; complete an erosion control plan and complete weekly self-inspection of the erosion control practices and post these inspections to the City of Madison website as required by Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances.
- 8. The applicant shall submit, prior to plan sign-off, digital CAD files to the Land Records Coordinator in the City Engineering Division. (Lori Zenchenko) <u>Izenchenko@cityofmadison.com</u>. The digital copies shall be drawn to scale and represent final construction including: building footprints, internal walkway areas, internal site parking areas, lot lines/ numbers/ dimensions, street names, and other miscellaneous impervious areas. All other levels (contours, elevations, etc) are not to be included with this file submittal. E-mail file transmissions are preferred. The digital CAD file shall be to scale and represent final construction. Any changes or additions to the location of the building, sidewalks, parking/pavement during construction will require a new CAD file. The single CAD file submittal can be either AutoCAD (dwg) Version 2001 or older, MicroStation (dgn) Version J or older, or Universal (dxf) format. Please include the site address in this transmittal.
- 9. The applicant shall submit, prior to plan sign-off, digital PDF files to the City Engineering Division. The digital copies shall be to scale, shall have a scale bar on the plan set, and shall contain the following items: building footprints; internal walkway areas; internal site parking areas; lot lines and right-of-way lines; street names, stormwater management facilities and; detail drawings associated with stormwater management facilities (including if applicable planting plans).
- 10. The applicant shall submit prior to plan sign-off, electronic copies of any Stormwater Management File including: SLAMM DAT files; RECARGA files; TR-55/HYDROCAD/etc., and; sediment loading calculations. If calculations are done by hand or are not available electronically the hand copies or printed output shall be scanned to a PDF file and provided.
- 11. All outstanding Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) and City of Madison sanitary sewer connection charges are due and payable prior to Engineering sign-off, unless otherwise collected with a Developer's / Subdivision Contract. Contact Janet Schmidt (261-9688) to obtain the final MMSD billing a minimum of two working days prior to requesting City Engineering signoff.
- 12. The site plan shall be revised to show all existing public sanitary sewer facilities in the project area as well as the size, invert elevation, and alignment of the proposed service.

Please contact Eric Halvorson of the Traffic Engineering Division at 266-6527 if you have any questions regarding the following six (6) items:

- 13. Extend sidewalk connection on the north side of the lot to the Woodman's crosswalk, include accessible ramps.
- 14. Look at the feasibility of adding a sidewalk on the southern side of the lot to accommodate pedestrians from the apartments to the south, include accessible ramps.

- 15. The applicant shall submit one contiguous plan for approval. The plan drawing shall be scaled to 1" = 20' and include the following, when applicable: existing and proposed property lines; parcel addresses; all easements; pavement markings; signing; building placement; items in the terrace such as signs, street light poles, hydrants; surface types such as asphalt, concrete, grass, sidewalk; driveway approaches, including those adjacent to and across street from the project lot location; parking stall dimensions, including 2 feet of vehicle overhang; drive aisle dimensions; semitrailer movement and vehicle routes; dimensions of radii; and percent of slope.
- 16. The developer shall post a security deposit prior to the start of development. In the event that modifications need to be made to any City owned and/or maintained traffic signals, street lighting, signing, pavement marking and conduit/handholes, the developer shall reimburse the City for all associated costs including engineering, labor and materials for both temporary and permanent installations.
- 17. The City Traffic Engineer may require public signing and marking related to the development; the developer shall be financially responsible for such signing and marking.
- 18. All parking facility design shall conform to the standards in MGO Section 10.08(6).

19. Note: All wells located on this property shall be abandoned if no valid well operation permit has been obtained from the Madison Water Utility in accordance with MGO Section 13.21.

Note: The Madison Fire Department does not object to this proposal provided the project complies with all applicable fire codes and ordinances.

Please contact Pat Anderson, Assistant Zoning Administrator, 266-5978 if you have any questions regarding the following seven (7) items:

- 20. Provide a reuse/recycling plan, to be reviewed and approved by the City's Recycling Coordinator, George Dreckmann, prior to a demolition permit being issued. MGO Section 28.12(12)(e) requires the submittal of documentation demonstrating compliance with the approved reuse and recycling plan. Please note, the owner must submit documentation of recycling and reuse within 60 days of completion of demolition.
- 21. This project is designed as a planned multi-use site. Pursuant to MGO Section 28.137(2)(a), planned multi-use site shall have a plan and reciprocal land use agreement approved by the Traffic Engineer, City Engineer and Director of Planning and Community and Economic Development and recorded in the office of the Dane County Register of Deeds.
- 22. Pursuant to MGO Section 28.142(3), Landscape Plan and Design Standards: Landscape plans for zoning lots greater than 10,000 square feet in size must be prepared by a registered landscape architect.

- 23. Exterior lighting provided shall be in accordance with MGO Section 10.085. Provide an exterior lighting plan and fixture cut sheets, with the final plan submittal.
- 24. Signage for this development will require a Comprehensive Design Review by the Urban Design Commission.
- 25. Bike parking shall comply with MGO Section 28.141, Table 28I-3 (General Regulations): Provide the minimum of 2 bike parking stalls in a safe and convenient location on an impervious surface to be shown on the final plan. NOTE: A bike-parking stall is 2 feet by 6 feet with a 5-foot access area. Provide details of bike rack on final plan sets.
- 26. Provide lot coverage calculation for the Woodman's property with the final plan sets.

Please contact my office at 261-9632 if you have any questions about the following three (3) items:

- 27. No outdoor amplified advertisements or music shall be permitted at any time.
- 28. The outdoor storage and sale of windshield wash, mulch, firewood, salt and other such materials shall not be permitted at any location on the subject site, including in the parking lot, on walkways adjacent to the convenience store or in the area of the pump islands.
- 29. The hours of operation for the convenience store shall be 6:00 a.m. to 9:00 p.m. daily. Modifications to these hours of operation shall be allowed only following the approval of a minor alteration to the conditional use by the Director of the Planning Division following a recommendation by the district alder. The sales of fuel shall be allowed 24 hours a day.

Specific questions regarding the comments or conditions contained in this letter should be directed to the commenting agency.

The applicant is also required to satisfy the conditions of approval of the Urban Design Commission prior to the final staff approval of the project and the issuance of permits. Please contact Al Martin, Urban Design Commission Secretary, at 267-8740 if you have any questions about those conditions.

Please now follow the procedures listed below for obtaining permits for your project:

- 1. After the plans have been revised per the above conditions, please file **nine (9) sets** of complete, fully dimensioned, and to-scale plans, the appropriate site plan review application and fee pursuant to Section 28.206 of the Zoning Code, and any other documentation requested herein with the Zoning Administrator, Room LL-100, Madison Municipal Building, 215 Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard. The sets of final revised plans or documents will be circulated by Zoning staff to the City department staff listed above for their final approval.
- 2. This letter shall be signed by the applicant and property owner (if not the applicant) to acknowledge the conditions of approval and returned to the Zoning Administrator when requesting building permit approval.
- 3. Provide a reuse/recycling plan, to be reviewed and approved by the City Recycling Coordinator prior to a demolition permit being issued. Section 28.185(10) of the Zoning Ordinance requires the

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submittal of documentation demonstrating compliance with the approved reuse and recycling plan. Please note, the owner must submit documentation of recycling and reuse within 60 days of completion of demolition.

- 4. The Madison Water Utility shall be notified to remove the water meter(s) prior to demolition.
- 5. Approval of the plans for this project does not include any approval to prune, remove or plant trees in the public right of way. Permission for such activities must be obtained from the City Forester, 266-4816.
- 6. No alteration of this proposal shall be permitted unless approved by the Plan Commission, provided, however, the Zoning Administrator may issue permits for minor alterations. No alteration of a conditional use shall be permitted unless approved by the Plan Commission provided, however, the Zoning Administrator following consideration by the alderperson of the district, may approve minor alterations or additions which are approved by the Director of Planning and Community and Economic Development and are compatible with the concept approved by the Plan Commission and the conditional use standards. This approval shall become null and void one (1) year after the date of the Plan Commission unless the use is commenced, construction is under way, or a valid building permit is issued and construction commenced within 6 months of the issuance of said building permit. Where the plans have not been altered from the Plan Commission's approval, and the conditional use has expired, the Director of Planning and Community and Economic Development may, after consultation with the Alderperson of the District, approve an extension for up to 24 months from the expiration date. The Plan Commission shall retain jurisdiction over this matter for the purpose of resolving complaints against the approved conditional use permit.
