Dear Ms. Burse;

The one-lot certified survey combining the Water Utility property located at 1613-1721 N. Sherman Avenue and 1713 Schlimgen Avenue, Section 31, Township 8N, Range 10E, City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, is hereby **conditionally approved**. The site is zoned TR-C4 (Traditional Residential-Consistent 4 District). The conditions of approval from the reviewing agencies to be satisfied before final approval and recording of the CSM are:

Please contact Janet Schmidt of the City Engineering Division at 261-9688 if you have questions regarding the following nine (9) conditions:

- 1. On sheet 2 of 4: remove the "1709 N. SHERMAN" text from the Madison Water Utility building footprint.
- 2. Update the City of Madison Common Council Approval adopted year from 2010 to 2013.
- 3. Add the reservation of right-of-way note shown per the plat of Clyde A. Gallagher's Sherman Ave. Subdivision over the west 16.5 feet of the proposed CSM.
- 4. Add "recorded as" data to dimensioning of the boundary where it has not been noted.
- 5. Add measured distances between monumentation found where it has not been noted.
- 6. A minimum of 2 working days prior to requesting City Engineering Division signoff on the CSM, the applicant shall contact Janet Schmidt (261-9688) to obtain the final stormwater utility charges that are due and payable prior to sub-division of the properties. The stormwater utility charges (as all

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utility charges) are due for the previous months of service. All charges shall be cleared prior to the land division (and subsequent obsolesces of the existing parcel).

- 7. Wisconsin Administrative Code A-E 7.08 identifies when Public Land System (PLS) tie sheets must be filed with the Dane County Surveyor's office. The developer's surveyor and/or applicant must submit copies of required tie sheets or condition reports for all monuments, including center of sections of record, used in this survey, to Eric Pederson, City Engineering Division. If a new tie sheet is not required under A-E 7.08, Engineering requests a copy of the latest tie sheet on record with Dane County Surveyor's office. The applicant shall identify monument types on all PLS corners included on the plat or CSM. Note: Land tie to two PLS corners required.
- 8. Prior to final approval, the owner shall obtain a permit to plug each existing sanitary sewer and/or storm sewer lateral that serves a building that is proposed for demolition. Prior to approval, the owner or owner's representative shall obtain a permit to plug each existing lateral that serves a building which is proposed for demolition. For each lateral to be plugged, the owner shall complete a sewer lateral plugging application and pay the applicable permit fees. Note: New plugging procedures and permit fees are in effect as of January 1, 2013.
- 9. In accordance with Section s. 236.18(8), Wisconsin Statutes, the applicant shall reference <u>City of Madison WCCS Dane Zone, 1997Coordinates</u> on all PLS corners on the Certified Survey Map in areas where this control exists. The surveyor shall identify any deviation from City Master Control with recorded and measured designations. The City of Madison has established WCCS, Dane Zone Coordinates on all PLS corners within its corporate boundary. If a surveyor encounters an area without a published WCCS Dane Zone 1997 value, contact the City Engineering Division for this information.

Please contact Jenny Frese of the Office of Real Estate Services at 267-8719 if you have any questions regarding the following four (4) items:

- 10. Prior to requesting approval sign-off of the CSM, executed signature block certifications shall be included for all parties of interest, pursuant to MGO Section 16.23(5)(g)4 and Wis. Stats. Section 236.21(2)(a). Please include a City of Madison Owner's certificate in place of the Water Utility certificate (per Vesting Deed recorded as Document No. 612443 and 612444).
- 11. All ownership consents and certifications for the subject lands shall conform to Wis. Stats. 236.21(2) and 236.29 by including the language "...surveyed, divided, mapped and <u>dedicated</u>..."
- 12. As of September 5, 2013, the 2012 real estate taxes are paid for the subject property and there are no special assessments reported.
- 13. Note: The Office of Real Estate Services will perform an in-house title update prior to final sign-off.

The demolition permit and conditional use approval for the redevelopment of the subject property shall receive final staff approval and be stamped "Approved" by the Zoning Administrator <u>prior</u> to the

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final approval and recording of this CSM. Please contact my office at 261-9632 if you have questions about this requirement.

Specific questions regarding the comments or conditions contained in this letter should be directed to the commenting agency.

A resolution approving the CSM and authorizing the City to sign it and any other documents related to the proposed land division was approved by the Common Council on September 17, 2013.

As soon as the comments and conditions have been satisfied as verified with a completed affidavit form (attached), the original along with the revised Certified Survey Map, with all signatures and approvals from the reviewing agencies, shall be brought to this office for final signoff. You or your client may then record the certified survey at the Dane County Register of Deeds. For information on recording procedures and fees, contact the Register of Deeds at 266-4141.

Prior to City Engineering final sign-off by the main office of the CSM, the final CSM shall be submitted to the Engineering Division Surveyor/ Land Records Coordinator for final technical review and approval. This submittal must occur a minimum of two working days prior to final Engineering Division signoff. Email submittal of the final CSM in PDF form is preferred. Transmit to epederson@cityofmadison.com.

Upon acceptance and recording of the certified survey map by the Dane County Register of Deeds, please transfer the recorded volume, document number, and page numbers to the copies and forward a copy to this office for our records. The original survey map with the recording information is permanently kept on file in the Dane County Register of Deeds Office. A copy of the recorded document can be obtained from the Register of Deeds Office, Room 110, City-County Building or the Real Estate Office in the Madison Department of Planning and Development.

Any appeal from this action, including the conditions of approval, must be filed with the Circuit Court within 30 days from the date of this letter. The approval of this CSM shall be null and void if not recorded in six (6) months from the date of the approving resolution or this letter, whichever is later.
