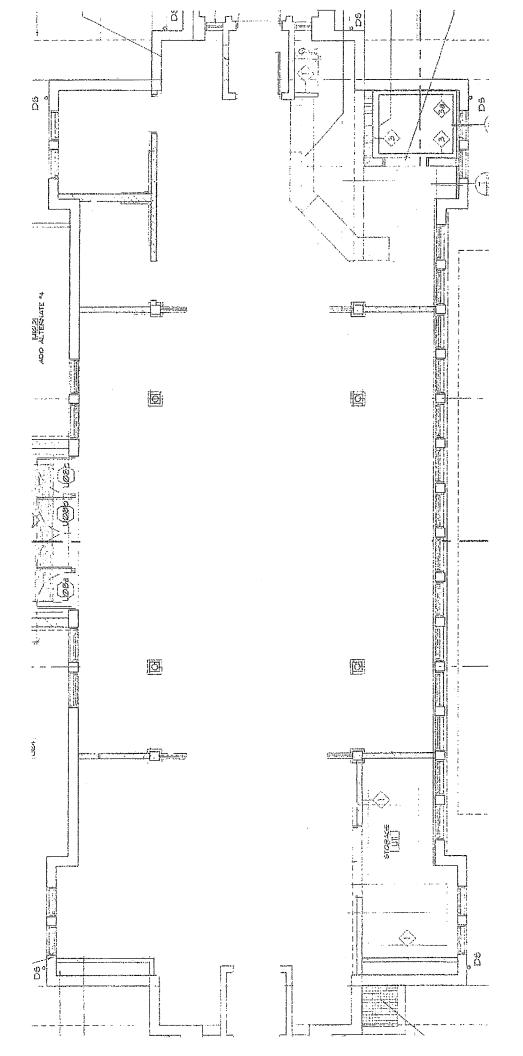
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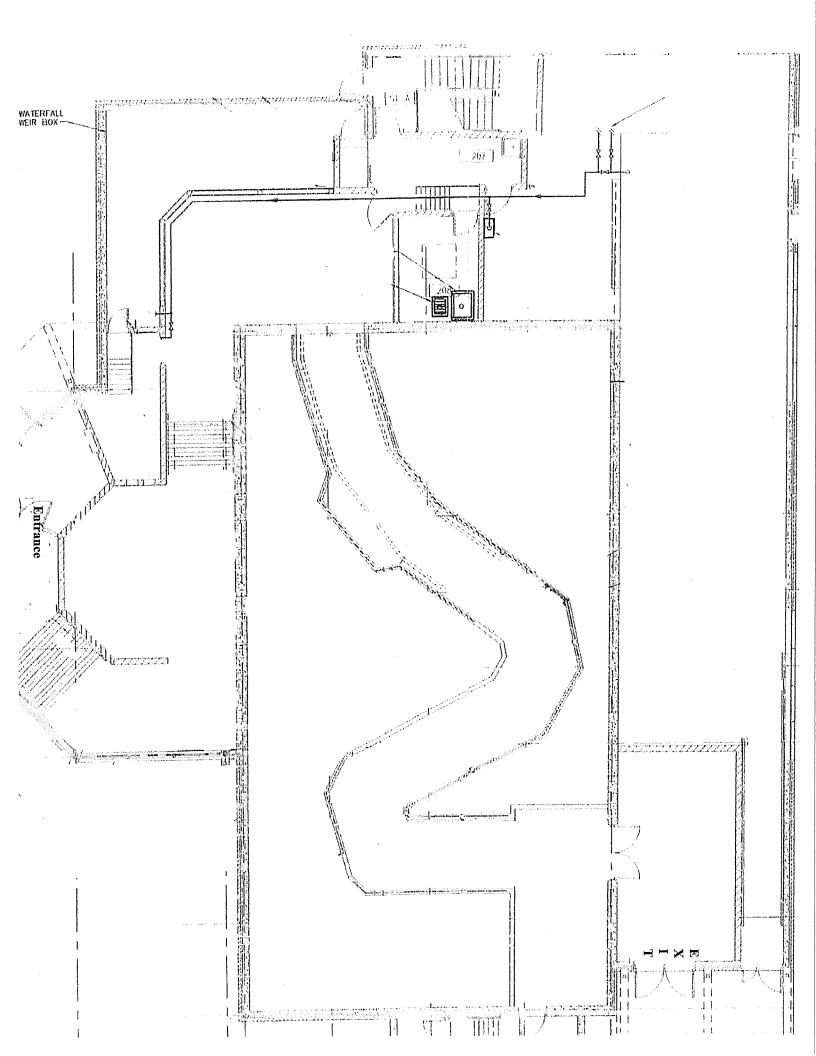
Henry Vilas Park Zoological Society Business Plan for Class B Beer and C Wine Liquor License

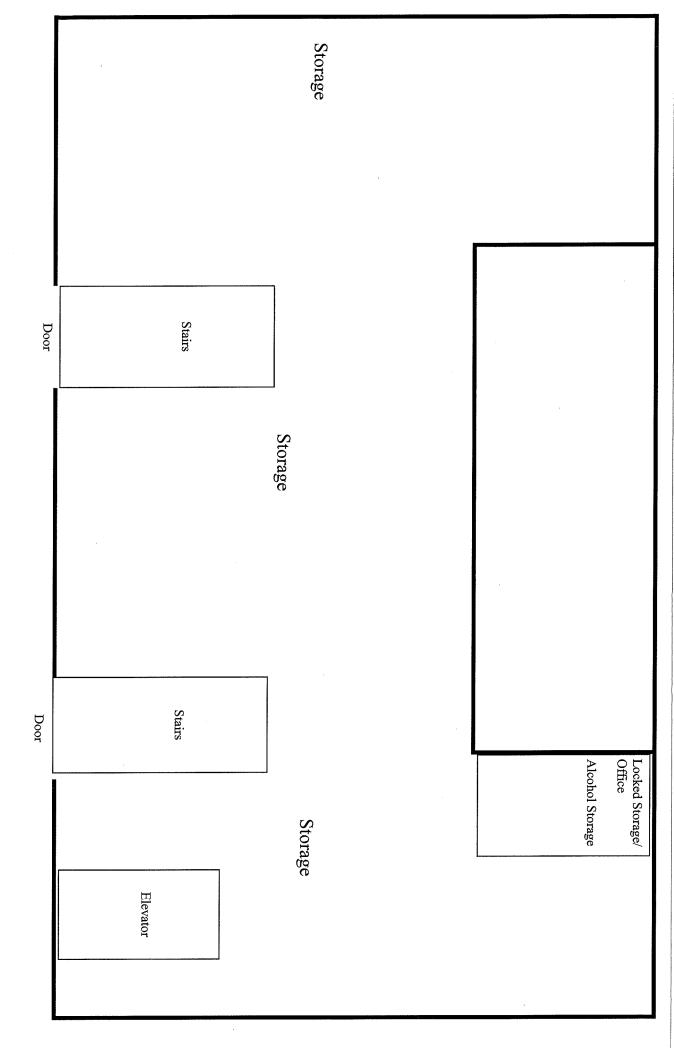

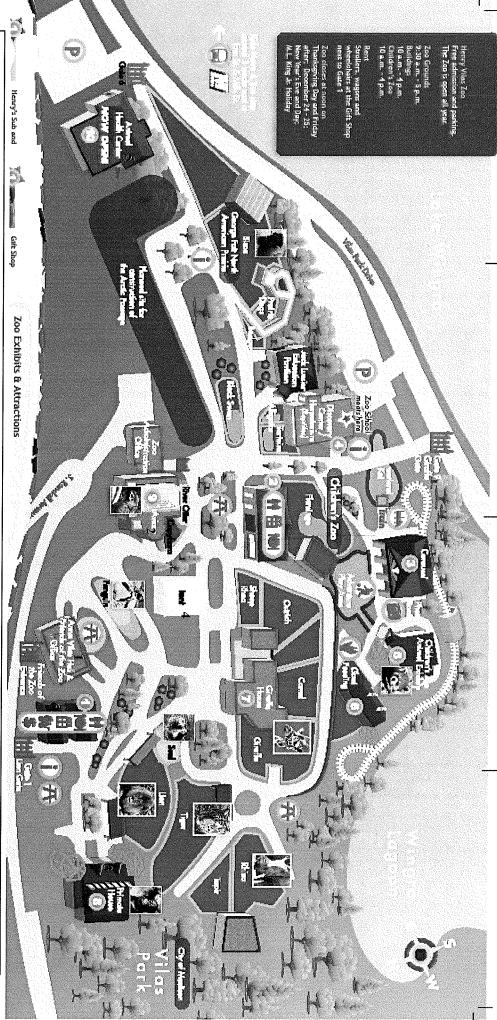




Primate Building
