<b>Options for New Class A Regs</b>			
Extend MGO to prohibit all types of alcohol sales at gas stations.		Original justification for no intoxicating liquor at gas stations was that it was incompatible with vehicle oriented business.	
Define and prohibit pharmacies selling alcohol.		Currently, pharmacies are not defined in MGO. Definition could be based off of percentage of sales tied to pharmaceuticals (above 50%?). Prohibition could be within Chap. 38 MGO or zoning as "accessory retail alcohol sales prohibited at pharmacies".	
Expand definition of "Food and Related Goods Sales" in zoning; set minimum size for accessory retail alcohol sales.		Minimum size would be tied to square footage of establishment. The effect would be to allow only accessory retail alcohol sales at large establishments, such as full-service grocery stores. Full-service liquor stores would be allowed.	
Set distance requirement from existing Class A; make prohibited use or conditional.		Set a 500 or 1000ft distance requirement from existing Class A liquor or beer license. Either prohibit the use of Class A within that distance or make a conditional use.
