# Text of Legislative File 35546

### **Fiscal Note**

The 2014 Capital Budget amendment needed is as follows:

Streets Division, Project #2 - Equipment: \$120,000 CE63-58599-810585 Other Equipment; (\$120,000) CE63-79140-810585 Promissory Note Proceeds.

After adoption of this resolution, an amendment to the 2015 Capital Budget will be submitted for the reauthorization of these funds from the 2014 Capital Budget to the 2015 Capital Budget.

#### Title

Amending the 2014 Capital Budget to allow for the purchase of an organic waste screen for the continuation and expansion of the organic waste collection pilot program.

## **Body**

Authors note: This resolution is expected to be replaced with a substitute by or on September, 15, 2014.

WHEREAS, the City of Madison and many of its residents and employers have made a commitment to sustainability; and,

WHEREAS, in anticipation of building its own biodigester the City of Madison has been undertaking a pilot program for organic waste collection that collected a wide range of compostable materials from businesses and residents, material that was then converted to compost and methane for reuse in agriculture and fuel; and,

WHEREAS, in order to continue the program it is necessary to purchase, at an estimated cost of \$120,000, a screen to remove non-compostable material from what is collected under the program;

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Common Council amends the 2014 Capital budget to allow the purchase of an organic waste screen to allow the continuation and expansion of the organic waste collection pilot program.
