REPORT TO THE MONONA TERRACE BOARD OF DIRECTORS

October 20, 2014

A. Administration:

- Jeff Griffith, Maintenance Supervisor, retired from Monona Terrace. Mike Waters is currently serving as Interim Manager.
- Two new Guest Services Attendants have been hired—Craig Howery and Faye McCamy.
- Monona Terrace plans to apply for the Wisconsin Forward Award again in 2015. We have been working on the improvement process since we last applied and are prepared for the next step.

B. **Operations:**

 AV is procuring new widescreen format, HD projectors with wide angle lenses. These will be offered to clients starting in 2015. The projectors are brighter and have higher quality image output. The wide angle lens allows for setting the projector closer to the screen to maximize the amount of space remaining in the room.

C. Community Relations:

- Lunchtime Yoga (spring & fall session):

- Staff has implemented a training program for various department representatives to begin posting on social media. In this way, posts can be more reflective of what is happening each day at Monona Terrace, and social media staff can allocate more time to strategy and analytics.
- Staff hosted a tour for Japanese travel writers on October 8. The group was organized by the GMCVB and WI Department of Tourism.
- Twenty-five volunteers attended the annual volunteer field trip on October 17.
 This year's itinerary included the Frank Lloyd Wright-designed Seth Peterson Cottage and the Wollersheim Winery.
- Staff is meeting with people involved in various maker communities in Madison to build a network that will recruit makers and volunteers for Maker Faire 2015 on May 16.

D. Gift Shop:

- Staff assisted with the Civics Club Book Sale for Jackie Joyner-Kersee. The next Civics Club Book Sale will be inMarch of 2015.
- New Frank Lloyd Wright merchandise is in stock including a Martin House Bird Feeder and some Oak Park Studio Glassware. There is more to come.
- New items are being added to the Gift Shop website.
- Orders are coming in for the next wave of rooftop tile sales.
- The upcoming annual Holiday Sale will run from Saturday, November 29th Tuesday, December 23rd.
