Action Text: Sponsor of the resolution, Alder Lisa Subeck said the proposed changes mirrored what was in the Budget. She hoped the TPC would recommend approval to move the item forward as the Council was interested in doing.

Subeck said the people most likely to use the meters downtown were visitors, who didn't live downtown. Downtown residents often had parking in their buildings or leased it. Many of her constituents frequently used meters when they came downtown; and some of them had been victims of tickets, inc. herself and her family. Certainly an increase in fines impacted everyone. Aside from the issue of tickets, it's simpler and cheaper to park in the ramps.

A motion was made by Golden, seconded by Dailey, to RECOMMEND TO COUNCIL TO ADOPT - REPORT OF OFFICER. The motion passed by voice vote/other.
