

Boulder - "municipalization!"



- Driven by climate action plan
- Four ballot initiatives and much <expensive> litigation
- Mayor -- "We many times asked Xcel if they would work with us, if there could be a shorter franchise, if there could be opt-out provisions, and they said no, no, no."



Minneapolis – "options!"








- Took advantage of franchise agreement renewal to align utility with city climate goals
- Launched by green NGOs, joined by local activists
- "Options" included municipalization, which Xcel was facing in Boulder.
- Outcomes:
 - Short franchise
 - Partnership between city and utilities
 - TBD



Madison –?







- Citizen group formed to fight fixed charge proposals
- Tactics: social and earned media, organizing events, research, mobilized public
- PSC decision was rubber stamped...
- Demanding options from MG&E
 - Reduce/repeal fixed charges
 - 25% renewables
 - Tie executive bonuses to carbon reductions
