

2015/16 ARTS EDUCATION RESIDENCIES

Trained and experienced professional artists in Literary, Media and Visual Arts, Drama/Theater, Dance and Music are available for both classroom and community education settings.

Common Denominators: The Connection Between Math and Popular Music Artist: Pacal Bayley Art Form: Music Academic Focus: Math

Popular music is known for being catchy, but it is also highly mathematical. In this residency, students will analyze mathematical patterns and unit fractions by listening to their favorite music and by creating original rhythms Grades 4-5

Drama and Science: A Sensory Approach to the Study of Earth and Life Science Systems Artist: Edie Baran

Art Form: Drama/Theater Academic Focus: Science

In this residency, your students will create living, moving sculptures demonstrating transformation and cause and effect of Earth and/or Life Science systems: this workshop is adaptable to your current curriculum needs. By using only their bodies and voices, students will enhance their academic understanding in this engaging process by creating each component of systems with their bodies and voices. Grades 1-6

Acting Out the Words: Enhancing Literacy through Story Theatre

WORKING ARTISTS IN THE CLASSROOM: EDUCATE ARTS EDUCATION RESIDENCIES

Time Travel through History with Theater Artist: Danielle Dresden Art Form: Drama/Theater Academic Focus: Social Studies

Dramatizing key moments in history provides students with a captivating way to explore course content and experience deeper learning. In this residency, students will hone their writing and acting skills as they develop and perform scenes about the individuals and issues behind the Civil War. The plan can be adapted to cover any historical period your class is studying. Grades 5-8

From Trash to Treasure: Creating Imaginative Sculptures from Found and Recycled Materials Artist: Leslie T. Iwai Art Form: Visual Arts Academic Focus: Science

The discarded and overlooked items that fill our world are rich with potential as we use imagination and innovation to discover this treasure in the most ordinary places. Using items from the recycling bin and the thrift store, students will go through a design process of imagining, sketching and brainstorming to dismantle and combine materials to create collaborative sculptures and stories while inspiring new ways of imagining how we inhabit our neighborhood and world. Grades 2-6

Celebrating Diversity through the Origins of Rock and Roll Artist: Jamie Kember Art Form: Music Academic Focus: Social Studies

Rock and Roll music was born out of America's rich diversity. While learning about the original rock and rollers of the 1950s and the music and cultures that influenced them, your students will recognize their diversity as an asset to our society, and how a society that celebrates diversity created the greatest music there ever was, Rock and Roll. Grades 7-12

What Happens Next: Hypothesis and Storytelling in Science and Theater

Artist: Terry Kerr Art Form: Drama/Theater Academic Focus: Science

In this innovative exploration of the intersection between science and theater, students think like a scientist as they learn a key process of the scientific method, forming a hypothesis. They then think like a theater artist and communicate what they have learned by performing original pieces for one another, other classrooms or for Grades 3-6

Walking in Another's Shoes: Using the Actor's Tools to Create Characters and **Understand Others** Artist: Terry Kerr Art Form: Drama/Theater Academic Focus: ELA/ Character Education

Students will strengthen empathy as they discover and embody the motivations and responses of characters who are not like themselves. Using the actor's tools students will think more deeply about the unseen elements of character and improvise short scenes using characters of their own creation or those found in a work being used in the classroom. Grades 2-8

Drawing on Descriptive Vocabulary: Using Still Life to Build Language Artist: Emily Keown Art Form: Visual Arts Academic Focus: English Language Arts

The still life becomes an active tool when used to develop a strong understanding of adjectives and synonyms in this residency. Through drawing exercises, students will build up to creating a carefully observed still life that will be paired with a thoughtfully crafted description highlighting new vocabulary of adjectives and Grades 7-12

2015/16 ARTS EDUCATION RESIDENCIES

Building Community and Cultural Appreciation through Singing Artist: Madison Youth Choirs, led by Lisa Kjentve Art Form: Music Academic Focus: Social Studies

In this residency, students explore the authentic connections between music and culture. The students will sing songs from different cultures, using music as a lens to discover the world and becoming "expert noticers" as they explore the historical context and heart of the music. Presented though Madison Youth Choirs. Grades 3-5

Animation Locomotion: The Art of Sequencing Artist: Amy Mietzel Art Form: Visual Arts Academic Focus: English Language Arts

The partnership of visual arts and kinesthetic movement provides an exciting and memorable way for students to think about and learn sequencing in writing. This residency is the perfect avenue to explore descriptive details and clear event sequences in writing of texts in the form of flipbooks. Grades 2-5



Becoming the Dream: Dramatic Characterizations of the Struggle for Civil Rights

Artist: Karen Olivo Art Form: Drama/Theater Academic Focus: History

In this residency, students will be transported to one of the nation's most courageous times in history, the Civil Rights Era. Translating the demands and events of the time, students will use their own creative writing to make Dr. King's dream one of their own. Tony Award-winning actress Karen Olivo will lead students through a personalized re-creation of the March on Washington using music, monologues and visuals while highlighting the fight for racial equality. Grades 4-8

Choreographing Language: Writing Dance Artist: Olivia Rivard Art Form: Dance

Academic Focus: English Language Arts

The written word and dance are languages that serve as communication as well as artistic exploration and creation. In this residency, students choreograph and perform their own dances using their writing as inspiration for and reflection on their dances. Grades 3-5



Visualizing History: Getting Graphic with the Past Artist: Bobbette Rose Art Form: Visual Arts Academic Focus: Social Studies

History gets a fresh look as students take a historic event or period to illustrate and create a graphic novel together. Students learn to identify main characters and build a story sequence. This residency can be adapted to any period you are teaching and give the students a way to deepen their understanding of the events. Grades 6-8

What's Your Story? Bringing Narrative Writing to Life through Theater Artist: Sarah Dolens-Moon Art Form: Drama/Theater Academic Focus: English Language Arts

Everyone has a story. Theater and narrative writing merge to enrich writing skills and enhance classroom community. Students will create a 2-3 minute oral narrative based on a written work. Students will learn acting and storytelling skills to enhance the telling of their stories.

Grades 3-6, adaptable for middle school as well.





What's Opera, Doc? Artist: "DocOpera" Dr. J. Adam Shelton Art Form: Opera Academic Focus: English

Language Arts

This exciting residency explores the inner workings of opera, building students' reading comprehension and writing skills while preparing them to see a live operatic performance. Students not only learn and sing an actual song from a show, but also they build their own unique synopsis, review, and conceptualization of the show in their Opera Journals. Grades 1-8

The Missing Piece: Geometry through Quilting Artist: Rebecca Stanley

Art Form: Visual Arts Academic Focus: Math

Shape your students' appreciation of geometry through its aesthetic application in the traditional art and craft of quilt piecing. Students manipulate paper and fabric to discover relationships between geometry, design, and construction, using concepts like angles, symmetry, congruence, concavity, and order of operations. Grades 5-8

TOMMY AWARDS

Named for local Broadway and television star Tom Wopat, the Tommy Awards recognize, honor and encourage excellence in high school musical theater. Each year, educators, industry professionals and theater experts review productions at more than 60 high schools, providing written reviews that offer valuable feedback and advice and honor schools and individuals' achievements with category-based awards. Each season culminates in a showcase performance on the Overture Hall stage, featuring the season's award winners. The performance is filmed and highlights are

broadcast by Wisconsin Public Television as part of its Young Performers Initiative. Overture Center's Tommy Awards is proud to be the official Wisconsin representative to The National High School Musical Theater Awards competition, sponsoring two outstanding performers in the week-long experience in New York City.

The 2015 Tommy Awards Ceremony will be held on Sunday, June 7.


