



### Zero: 2016 Background

- Madison area one of 71 communities selected in November 2014.
- Communities commit to end veteran homelessness by the end of 2015 and chronic homelessness for individuals by the end of 2016.
- Receiving technical assistance to analyze our current provider system and make data-driven changes.

#### Zero: 2016 Goals

 Homeless Services Consortium Leadership and Board will lead effort to end homelessness for 130 veterans by 2015, 135 chronically homeless by 2016, and 400 families by 2017.

#### Zero: 2016 Goals

• We will engage individuals who are experiencing homelessness or are formerly homeless, elected officials, housing and service providers, advocates, landlords, developers and funders.

#### Zero: 2016 Goals

• We will use coordinated entry, provide comprehensive wrap-around services, and make data driven decisions. After this is accomplished homelessness will be brief, rare and non-recurring.


#### Zero: 2016 - Key Components

- Zero 2016 Steering Committee: Comprised of providers, advocates, and government staff has been meeting regularly to move effort forward.
- <u>VI SPDAT:</u> Vulnerability Index Service Prioritization Decision Assessment Tool providers use to determine individual's vulnerability on the streets.
- <u>Housing Prioritization Lists:</u> Priority lists to obtain permanent housing based on needs (rapid re-housing, supportive housing), informed by VI-SPDAT assessment of individuals and families.


### Zero: 2016 - Key Components

- <u>VA Partnership:</u> Working with local VA staff to identify veterans in need and help with housing placement.
- Housing Placement Group: Will meet regularly to identify housing availability and help place individuals into housing.
- <u>Housing First:</u> No barriers to obtain housing, with supportive services, for those who wish to engage in them.

### How the Community Can Help

- <u>Identify Housing Units:</u> Partnering to find the number of units necessary to house individuals in need.
- <u>Supportive Services:</u> Resources to provide supportive services needed to help people maintain housing.

- <u>Activate Your Network:</u> Help make connections to landlords, developers, other concerned citizens.
