Library Director Report October 2015

WISCONSIN BOOK FESTIVAL

This the third year since Madison Public Library took over the festival. It continues to be a very successful marquee event for us. The new approach of the WBF to be a year-round program has increased its popularity in the community, but the 4 non-stop days of authors and artists is still very special. C-Span was once again at the WBF and expanded its coverage to an entire day of events. The direction of Conor Moran and Tana Elias coupled with many staff are at the source of the success of the WBF. It just continues to get better and better each year.

BUDGET 2016

We are now in the awkward waiting period until the final Common Council approval process begins on Nov 10th. The Executive Operating Budget is positive for us with an increase that includes funding for additional positions as well as some fills to FTE status. The amended Capital Improvement Plan budget also meets the needs for the relocation of Pinney. If our budget is approved as we stand now we will be in good shape for 2016.

SOCIAL SERVICES AT CENTRAL

We are very fortunate to have the support of Mayor Soglin and the Community Development Department for their continued funding for the caseworkers at Central Library. This resource has helped many individuals and families. The impact of this service really came to light recently. Staff coming to work at Central had been running into a single parent with 2 children who had been sleeping overnight on our loading dock. Library staff and Porchlight staff from the Central Library office made contact with the family and are working to find shelter for them. Unfortunately shelter for the family has been difficult to locate but this family now has someone working for her to help her provide this basic human need for her and her two children.

LIBRARY SITING AND ALLOCATION

Mark Benno and city engineering have selected a design team for the Badger Building.

Catherine Duarte has started to compile the information that has been collected through the Tell Us program. We plan to use this information to begin to write an outline for our RFP for the design of Pinney Library.

VISIT FROM FRISCO, TEXAS & other info request

Right on heels of Seattle Public Library touring our Central Library and meeting with staff we received a similar request from Frisco, TX. Their Library Director was joined by the City Manager, Library Board President, and other staff for a tour of Central Library and discussion of our programming agenda.

Mark Benno and I had a conference call with the Whitewater PL Library Board to provide input for a possible central library expansion in their community. This was a follow up to a recent tour of MPL's Central Library by their Library Director and City Manager.

RACIAL EQUITY AND SOCIAL JUSTICE

Tori Pettaway, the new Equity Coordinator for the City of Madison, sent a link as part of her department's exciting opportunity to help move the Racial Equity and Social Justice Initiatives to the next level. They recently created the Madison's Equitable Future Video with the goal of generating discussions about the City's continued commitment to advancing racial equity. Catherine Duarte, MPL's Library Planner, represented the Library in the video and did a terrific job of sharing the RESJ work at MPL.
