







2015 Campus Master Plan Update - Scope





Overall Schedule - 45% complete










Non-motorized Connectivity

Superblock: Interior Quad






- Additional central campus parking to replace spaces removed along the lake.

- Need to address stacking and back-up concerns on Charter at W. Johnson St. for eastbound traffic



South Campus: Central Quad on W. Dayton Street






- New Central Quad in block south of Grainger Hall and west to Educational Sciences

- West Dayton Street as a Complete Street, Green Street


West Dayton Street Cross section






