Madison has one of the highest median housing costs in the state while people with disabilities, on average, have a lower household income than the general population; affordable housing remains a critical need. People with disabilities require stability and continuity for them to be successful in their communities and home ownership generates both. Movin' Out hopes to continue its homebuyer program using 2015 funds to support four households with down payment assistance toward the purchase of their own home. Over the past four years Movin' Out has granted more than double that amount to households each year. The recent demand for this funding has increased resulting in all current funding spent or fully reserved. A waiting list for funding has been started.

The target population is adults and children with disabilities and their families who have a household income of less than 80% of the county median. However, the clients MOI serves have an average household income of 44% county median.
