To whom it may concern at the Board of Public Works:

My name is Erin Eagleman and I live on the 500 block of South Paterson Street in the Marquette neighborhood. I am writing in support of undergrounding the power lines that line Jenifer Street.

I understand that work will begin this year to update the existing sewer lines, and that with this construction will come the removal of many of the street's large canopy trees, followed by the planting of small shrub trees. The trees in our neighborhood are not just a beautiful part of what makes this historic area so special; sure they look amazing, but they are so much more to so many of us.

First, as someone who is relatively new to the Madison, the Isthmus and the Marquette neighborhood, I'd like to make clear how amazed my family and I were with how very lush and green the great, mature foliage in this neighborhood was when we moved here. In comparison, small shrub trees will provide our homes with no protection from the sun.

As a nature lover and as a parent of nature lovers, I'm amazed at the awesome wildlife we see in the canopy trees on our neighborhood. In a city! These old, huge trees provide refuge to so many living creatures, creatures that couldn't live in shrub trees. If we don't replant canopy trees we will likely lose an unfathomable amount of nature right out our front doors.
