RE: Approval of a rezoning of **4824 Tradewinds Parkway** from the Industrial Limited (IL) District to the Suburban Employment (SE) District as well as approval of an alteration to a conditional use to allow construction of an addition to an existing hotel at **4802-4824 Tradewinds Parkway**.

Dear Mr. Wilson:

At its March 15, 2016 meeting, the Common Council, meeting in regular session, found the standards met and **approved** your client's request for a zoning map amendment for **4802-4824 Tradewinds Parkway**, rezoning the property from IL (Industrial Limited District) to SE (Suburban Employment District). At its March 7, 2016 meeting, the Plan Commission, meeting in regular session, found the standards met and **approved** your client's request for an alteration to a conditional use to allow construction of an addition to an existing hotel at **4802-4824 Tradewinds Parkway**. In order to receive final approval of the rezoning and conditional use, and for any permits to be issued for your project, the following conditions shall be met:

# Please contact Brenda Stanley, City Engineering, at 261-9127 if you have any questions regarding the following eighteen (18) items:

- 1. The existing private stormwater mngt easement shall be released and a new one recorded over the proposed new location for this facility
- All outstanding Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) charges are due and payable prior to Engineering sign-off, unless otherwise collected with a Developer's / Subdivision Contract. Contact Mark Moder (608-261-9250) to obtain the final MMSD billing a minimum of two (2) working days prior to requesting City Engineering signoff. (MGO 16.23(9)(d)(4)
- 3. The site plan shall be revised to show all existing public sanitary sewer facilities in the project area as well as the size, invert elevation, and alignment of the proposed service. (POLICY)
- 4. This project falls in the area subject to increased erosion control enforcement as authorized by the fact that it is in the ROCK RIVER TMDL ZONE and by Resolution 14-00043 passed by the City of Madison Common Council on 1/21/2014. You will be expected to meet a higher standard of erosion control than the minimum standards set by the WDNR.

- 5. The Applicant shall submit, prior to plan sign-off but after all revisions have been completed, a digital CAD file (single file) to the Engineering Division with any private storm and sanitary sewer utilities. The digital CAD file shall be to scale and represent final construction. The CAD file shall be in a designated coordinate system (preferably Dane County WISCRS, US Ft). The single CAD file submittal can be either AutoCAD (dwg) Version 2013 or older, MicroStation (dgn) V8i Select Series 3 or older, or Universal (dxf) format and shall contain the only the following data, each on a separate layer name/level number:
  - a) Building Footprints
  - b) Internal Walkway Areas
  - c) Internal Site Parking Areas
  - d) Other Miscellaneous Impervious Areas (i.e. gravel, crushed stone, bituminous/asphalt, concrete, etc.)
  - e) Right-of-Way lines (public and private)
  - f) Lot lines or parcel lines if unplatted
  - g) Lot numbers or the words unplatted
  - h) Lot/Plat dimensions
  - i) Street names
  - j) Private on-site sanitary sewer utilities (including all connections to public sanitary)
  - k) Private on-site storm sewer utilities (including all connections to public storm)

All other levels (contours, elevations, etc) are not to be included with this file submittal.

NOTE: Email CAD file transmissions are preferred to: <u>bstanley@cityofmadison.com</u> (East) or <u>ttroester@cityofmadison.com</u> (West). Include the site address in the subject line of this transmittal. Any changes or additions to the location of the building, sidewalks, parking/pavement, private on-site sanitary sewer utilities, or private on-site storm sewer utilities during construction will require a new CAD file.

- 6. The Applicant shall submit prior to plan sign-off, electronic copies of any Stormwater Management Files including:
  - a) SLAMM DAT files
  - b) RECARGA files
  - c) TR-55/HYDROCAD/Etc
  - d) Sediment loading calculations. If calculations are done by hand or are not available electronically the hand copies or printed output shall be scanned to a PDF file and provided. (POLICY and MGO 37.09(2))
- 7. The applicant shall demonstrate compliance with Section 37.07 and 37.08 of the Madison General Ordinances regarding permissible soil loss rates. The erosion control plan shall include Universal Soil Loss Equation (USLE) computations for the construction period. Measures shall be implemented in order to maintain a soil loss rate below 5.0 tons per acre per year.

- 8. This site appears to disturb over one (1) acre of land and requires a permit from the WDNR for stormwater management and erosion control. The City of Madison has been required by the WDNR to review projects for compliance with NR216 and NR-151 however a separate permit submittal is still required to the WDNR for this work. The City of Madison cannot issue our permit until concurrence is obtained from the WDNR via their NOI or WRAPP permit process. Contact Eric Rortvedt at 273-5612 of the WDNR to discuss this requirement. - 9. Prior to approval, this project shall comply with Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances regarding stormwater management. Specifically, this development is required to detain the 2, 10, & 100 -year storm events, matching post development rates to predevelopment rates.
- 10. Prior to approval, this project shall comply with Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances regarding stormwater management. Specifically, this development is required to reduce TSS by 80% (control the 5 micron particle) off of newly developed areas compared to no controls.
- 11. Prior to approval, this project shall comply with Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances regarding stormwater management. Specifically, this development is required to provide infiltration in accordance with Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances.
- 12. Complete an erosion control plan and complete weekly self-inspection of the erosion control practices and post these inspections to the City of Madison website as required by Chapter 37 of the Madison General Ordinances.
- 13. Oil and grease treatment is required for this site
- 14. The applicant's utility contractor shall obtain a connection permit and excavation permit prior to commencing the storm sewer construction. MGO 37.05(7) This permit application is available on line at <a href="http://www.cityofmadison.com/engineering/permits.cfm">http://www.cityofmadison.com/engineering/permits.cfm</a>.
- 15. Prior to approval, provide a profile sketch of proposed sanitary sewer lateral where it intersects the proposed pond.
- 16. The Applicant shall replace all sidewalk and curb and gutter which abuts the property which is damaged by the construction or any sidewalk and curb and gutter which the City Engineer determines needs to be replaced because it is not at a desirable grade regardless of whether the condition existed prior to beginning construction. (POLICY)
- 17. All work in the public right-of-way shall be performed by a City licensed contractor. (MGO 16.23(9)(c)5) and MGO 23.01)
- 18. All damage to the pavement on TradeWinds Pkwy, adjacent to this development shall be restored in accordance with the City of Madison's Pavement Patching Criteria. - 19. The pending Certified Survey Map application for this property shall be completed and recorded with the Dane County Register of Deeds (ROD) prior to issuance of any building permits for new construction. When the recorded CSM image is available from the ROD, the Assessor's Office can then create the new Address-Parcel- Owner (APO) data in GEO so that the Accela system can upload this data and permit issuance made available for this new land record
- 20. Submit a PDF of all floor plans to <u>lzenchenko@cityofmadison.com</u> so that a preliminary interior addressing plan can be developed prior to plans being submitted for permit review. If there are any changes pertaining to the location of a hotel room, the deletion or addition of a room, or to the location of the entrance into any room, (before, during, or after construction) the addresses may need to be changed. The interior address plan is subject to the review and approval of the Fire Marshal.

- 21. The applicant shall submit one contiguous plan showing proposed conditions and one contiguous plan showing Existing conditions for approval. The plan drawings shall be scaled to 1" = 20' and include the following, when applicable: existing and proposed property lines; parcel addresses; all easements; pavement markings; signing; building placement; items in the terrace such as signs, street light poles, hydrants; surface types such as asphalt, concrete, grass, sidewalk; driveway approaches, including those adjacent to and across street from the project lot location; parking stall dimensions, including two (2) feet of vehicle overhang; drive aisle dimensions; semitrailer movement and vehicle routes; dimensions of radii; and percent of slope.
- 22. The Developer shall post a security deposit prior to the start of development. In the event that modifications need to be made to any City owned and/or maintained traffic signals, street lighting, signing, pavement marking and conduit/handholes, the Developer shall reimburse the City for all associated costs including engineering, labor and materials for both temporary and permanent installations.
- 23. The City Traffic Engineer may require public signing and marking related to the development; the Developer shall be financially responsible for such signing and marking.
- 24. All parking facility design shall conform to MGO standards, as set in section 10.08(6).
- 25. Traffic Engineering will no longer be accepting paper plans; to ensure a timely review all submittals will include an electronic copy (.pdf preferred).

Please contact Jenny Kirchgatter, Assistant Zoning Administrator, at 266-4429 if you have questions regarding the following seven (7) items. Note that Comment #27 was modified by the Plan Commission as noted below:

- 26. Provide a calculation and plan detail for lot coverage with the final submittal. The lot coverage maximum for the Suburban Employment zoning district is 75%. Lot coverage is defined as the total area of all buildings, measured at grade, all accessory structures including pools, patios, etc., and all paved areas as a percentage of the total area of the lot, with the following exceptions: sidewalks or paved paths no wider than five (5) feet, pervious pavement, green roofs and decks.
- 27. Required loading facilities shall comply with MGO Section 28.141(13). Provide two (10' x 50') loading areas with 14' vertical clearance to be shown on the plan. The loading areas shall be exclusive of drive aisle and maneuvering space. The required number of loading spaces may be reduced through conditional use approval. Note: the Plan Commission approved the loading area as shown on the plans.
- 28. Provide a minimum of 16 short-term bicycle stalls located in a convenient and visible area. Show the dimensions of the bicycle stalls including the access aisle on the site plan. A bicycle stall is a minimum of two (2) feet by six (6) feet with a five (5) foot wide access area. Submit a detail showing the model of bike rack to be installed.
- 29. Submit the landscape plan and landscape worksheet stamped by the registered landscape architect. Per Section 28.142(3) Landscape Plan and Design Standards, landscape plans for zoning lots greater than ten thousand (10,000) square feet in size must be prepared by a registered landscape architect. Indentify existing as well as proposed landscaping.
  - a. Provide adequate development frontage landscaping per section 28.142(5) Development Frontage Landscaping.
  - b. Show that the planting beds, islands, or planted areas contain at least 75% vegetative cover mulched. Mulch shall consist of shredded bark, chipped wood or other organic material installed at a minimum depth of two (2) inches.
- 30. Exterior lighting provided shall be in accordance with City of Madison General Ordinances Section 10.085. Provide an exterior lighting plan and fixture cut sheets, with the final plan submittal.
- 31. Per Section 28.186(4)(b), the property owner or operator is required to bring the property into compliance with all elements of the approved site plans by the date established by the Zoning Administrator as part of the site and building plan approval. Work with Zoning staff to establish a final site compliance date.
- 32. Signage approvals are not granted by the Plan Commission. Signage must be reviewed for compliance with Chapter 31 Sign Codes of the Madison General Ordinances and Chapter 33 Urban Design District ordinances. Signage permits are issued by the Zoning Section of the Department of Planning and Community and Economic Development.

### Please contact Bill Sullivan, Fire Department, at 261-9658 if you have any questions regarding the following item:

- 33. Provide fire apparatus access as required by IFC 503 2015 edition, MGO 34.503, as follows:
  - a. The site plans shall clearly identify the location of all fire lanes.
  - b. MGO 34.503/IFC 503 Appendix D105, Provide an aerial apparatus access fire lane that is at least 26-feet wide, if any part of the building is over 30 feet in height. The near edge of the aerial fire lane shall be within 30-feet and not closer than 15 feet from the structure, and parallel to one entire side. The aerial fire lane shall cover not less than 25% of the building perimeter.

# Please contact Dennis Cawley, Water Utility, at 266-4651 if you have any questions regarding the following item:

34. All operating private wells shall be identified and permitted by the Water Utility in accordance with MGO 13.21. All unused private wells shall be abandoned in accordance with MGO 13.21.

This property is in a Wellhead Protection District–Zone (31). This proposed use is permitted by the Madison Wellhead Protection Ordinance. Any future change in use for this property will require review by the Madison Water Utility General Manager or his designated representative.

# Please contact Tim Sobota, Metro Transit, at 261-4289 if you have any questions regarding the following two (2) items:

- 35. Metro Transit provides limited bus service just under 1/2 mile walking distance from the proposed site. The closest bus stop with service is on Agriculture Drive, at the Tradewinds Parkway intersection.
- 36. Metro Transit has planned incremental expansion of service available at the bus stop above adding weekday evening and extending weekend service hours that will start in August of 2016.

### Please contact my office at 261-9135, if you have questions regarding the following five (5) items:

- 37. Landscaping shall be added to screen the parking lot from the Beltline with details to be approved by the Urban Design Commission and Planning Staff. (MGO 33.24(8)(c)(5)(a)ii)
- 38. That the applicant shall revise the landscape plan per the feedback from the February 24, 2016 Urban Design Commission meeting. They will need to gain final approval from the Urban Design Commission and Planning Division before final sign off.
- 39. That the applicant submit a highway noise abatement study for review and approval by the Planning Division and Traffic Engineering Division that indicates the present and 20-year future highway-induced noise levels resulting from the Beltline Highway (US 12 & 18) on the subject site. If the study indicates that current or projected noise levels will exceed 67 decibels for any outdoor recreational facilities related to the hotel, the applicant shall submit an abatement plan that specifies how those areas will comply with the maximum noise levels permitted in Wisconsin Administrative Code Chapter 405. The Planning Division shall approve the noise abatement plan and any improvements related thereto.

- 40. That a note be placed on the final plans certifying that the highway traffic-induced interior noise levels in all parts of the proposed hotel will not exceed 52 decibels. (Trans 233.105)
- 41. Any signs within the fifty (50) ft highway setback line shall be removed in order to comply with the note on the face of the Tradewinds Business Centre Plat which reads: "No improvements or structures are allowed between the right-of-way line and the highway setback line. Improvements and structures include, but are not limited to, signs, parking areas, driveways, wells, septic systems, drainage facilities, buildings and retaining walls. It is expressly intended that this restriction is for the benefit of the public as provided in section 236.293, Wisconsin Statutes, and shall be enforceable by the Wisconsin Department of Transportation or its assigns. Contact the Wisconsin Department of Transportation. The phone number may be obtained by contacting the County Highway Department." (Trans 233.08)

Specific questions regarding the comments or conditions contained in this letter should be directed to the commenting agency.

The applicant is also required to satisfy the conditions of approval of the Urban Design Commission prior to the final staff approval of the project and the issuance of building permits. Please contact Al Martin, Urban Design Commission Secretary, at 267-8740 if you have any questions about those conditions.

#### Please now follow the procedures listed below for finalizing your approval:

- Please revise your plans per the above conditions and submit seven (7) copies of a complete, fully dimensioned and scaled plan set to the Zoning Administrator for final review and comment. Also be sure to include any additional materials requested by these departments for their approval prior to sign off. The final site plan shall be accompanied by the appropriate site plan review application and fee pursuant to Section 28.206 of the Zoning Code, and any other documentation requested herein with the Zoning Administrator, Room LL-100, Madison Municipal Building, 215 Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard. This submittal shall all also include one complete digital plan set in PDF format. The sets of final revised plans or documents will be circulated by the Zoning staff to the City department staff listed above for their final approval.
- 2. This property is in a Wellhead Protection District–Zone (31). This proposed use is permitted by the Madison Wellhead Protection Ordinance. Any future change in use for this property will require review by the Madison Water Utility General Manager or his designated representative.
- 3. This letter shall be signed by the applicant to acknowledge the conditions of approval and returned to the Zoning Administrator when requesting conditional use approval.
- 4. The conditional use approval is valid for one (1) year from the date of the Plan Commission approval. During this time, the applicant must either lawfully commence the use or obtain a building permit and begin erecting the building. If the applicant obtains a valid building permit, construction must commence within six (6) months of the date of issuance. The building permit shall not be renewed unless construction has commenced as is being diligently prosecuted.

- 5. No alteration of a conditional use shall be permitted unless approved by the Plan Commission provided, however, the Zoning Administrator may issue permits for minor alterations or additions which are approved by the Director of Planning and Community and Economic Development and are compatible with the concept approved by the City Plan Commission and the conditional use approval standards.
- 6. The Plan Commission retains continuing jurisdiction over all conditional uses for the purpose of resolving complaints against all previously approved conditional uses.
