- 9. Narrative (500 word max.):
  The City of Madison Fire Department Paramedics and Tactical Paramedics, as well as the City of Madison Police Department SWAT Operators are trained and equipped to provide emergent needle decompression of the thorax in the presence of a tension pneumothorax. This life-saving intervention must be performed quickly and with precision, often in a

chaotic or austere environment. The patient assessment – or assessing the need to provide needle decompression is just as important at the actual intervention. Currently, the City of Madison does not own, and does not have funding for a training simulator that allows for assessment of the chest and management of a tension pneumothorax. The Nasco/Simulaid Tension Pneumothorax Simulator allows for both assessment and management of a tensioning thorax. This simulator would benefit the ~80 paramedics of the City of Madison Fire Department (including the 10 Tactical Paramedics), as well as the 20(+) Madison Police Department SWAT Operators. This simulator will be used for both ongoing/refresher training as well as for the training of new paramedics, tactical paramedics, and SWAT Operators. The requested replacement lungs and skin will allow for each provider to use the simulator one time before additional re-supplies are needed. We understand this is a one-time grant, and that after initial training of all providers, the replacement parts would be the financial responsibility of the City of Madison.

Narrative (500 word max.):

Dane County EMS is comprised of 21 agencies, covering a population of >500,000 and over 37,000 ambulance calls annually. We work closely as a system utilizing consistent protocols, training and quality assurance. EMS Agencies in Dane County currently collaborate by using one platform for patient care reporting, this is an Imagetrend product we call Dane Bridge. We have found it to be an outstanding tool for EMS and Hospitals as the consistency in format, questions being answered and data being required has led to accurate data and improved patient care. Our goal with the Datamart being requested is to expand our capabilities with the data to benefit all our coalition members. The data in this format will allow us to analyze more deeply to include hotspot areas on a map. This will allow Public Health and Emergency Management to better monitor for trends in areas of influenza, fevers, overdose/poisoning, infant deaths just to name a few areas. The hospitals and EMS will have a more robust way to pull apart the data, analyze narratives being written and improve our patient care and caregiver satisfaction and quality improvement by receiving real time outcomes. In our current attempt to analyze the data we are seeing areas of concern, for example overdose situations being missed in our data pulls because Naloxone is administered prior to EMS arrival so it is only documented in the narrative, not in a data field that is retrievable. This datamart would allow us to capture this type of situation.

EMS data is critical to all our partners, EMS is often the only area of healthcare to be in the homes of our patients. With this knowledge we can make a difference in prevention and overall community health. We feel our data will also help to provide insight to our entire coalition and the State of Wisconsin. What we see trending in Dane County is likely a concern across the State and Country.

Thank you for submitting an application for the SCHCC Micro-grant Program. A total of 50 applications were received; 27 from EMS/fire/police; 20 from hospitals/clinics; and, 3 from public health, totaling \$192,000. We appreciated the time, effort, and thought that went into all of your proposals. Last week the SCHCC Board reviewed all submitted proposals and scored and thoughtfully discussed which should receive grant funding.

The SCHCC Board has approved your proposal for Ebola related equipment for the amount of \$10,710. To include:

- \* Twelve (12) Scott Safety 742 Series Twin Replacement Cartridges at \$ 16.40 = \$ 196.80
- \* Four (4) Scott Safety 742 Series Twin Cartridge Adaptors at \$45.34 = \$181.36
- Two (2) sets of isolation units at \$4.870.00 = \$9.740.00
- \* One (1) case of each size (M, L, XL, XXL) Nitrile Gloves. 4 at \$ 147.90 /cs. = \$591.16

Proposal Title/Brief Description: Funding to support participation of the Madison TEMS Team in tactical medical training at the Mercy Regional Tactical Medical Training Facility.

Requested Amount: \$7000

#### Narrative:

The Madison TEMS Team is a collaborative unit of the City of Madison Police and Fire Departments. The team is comprised of 10 Fire Department paramedics that operate under the leadership and operations of the Madison Police department. As a separate entity, outside of both the FD and the PD, the TEMS Team does not have a unique budget, and is therefore very limited in the ability to obtain funds for tactical medical training. Neither the FD nor the PD have staffing or budget funds available to support our team's participation in a unique training opportunities such as this one.

The Mercy Hospital and Trauma Center's Regional Tactical Medical Training Facility was completed in 2015 and bring state-of-the-art, real-life simulated training experiences to its students. Unique to this training venue is its simulated medical care facility: Tactical Medics and LE Officers can learn to provide tactical medical care, and carry-out tactical operations in simulated health-care setting, such as a clinic and a hospital wing. Medical care facilities bring many unique challenges to tactical responders. Learning to manage hostage, barricaded and active-shooter situations in a medical environment is vitally important to the safety and wellbeing of our regions health-care providers and their patients. By attending this unique training opportunity, our tactical medics will be better prepared to respond to any of the 6 hospitals, or many, many clinics of varying specialty in our city, While our primary territory is the City of Madison, we provide back-up support to the Dane County TRT Team, and provide mutual-aid to our neighboring agencies. We commonly work in unison with County, State, and Federal agencies during our tactical operations.

We are requesting funding to support the one-time participation of our 10 TEMS medics to train at the Mercy Regional Tactical Training Facility. We are requesting \$700/medic, for a total of \$7000. This amount covers tuition, time, and consumables associated with the training.

Please note: Participation by our team members must be done while on-duty. Due to a total lack of available budget funds, tuition payment only, co-payment, etc will not allow our teams participation. In the event that our full team of 10 medics cannot be fully funded, we would be grateful to receive funding to allow as many medics as possible to attend, at \$700/medic.
