

## **University Hill Farms Neighborhood Plan 2015**

Community gardens are mentioned in the Introduction, Regional Context and Planning Study Area narratives on pages 2-5. Sheboygan Garden is noted as contributing to the “attractiveness” of living in the planning area, and a “neighborhood asset”.

Map 3: Neighborhood Assets highlights Sheboygan Garden and two farmers’ markets (page 5)

Purpose of the Planning Process identifies community gardens as an asset to be enhanced (page 6)

Recommendations for Garner and Rennebohm Parks include gardens (pages 57, 60)

Recommendations for Community Facilities include (pages 66-68)

- Outdoor classrooms proposed for schools
- Hamilton School garden locations along South Segoe Road
- Identify location for potential new community gardens. Possible locations include terracing along the right side of the drive off of South Segoe Road or the southern edge of the school property.
- Placemaking and Community Building highlighted “to inspire people to improve their community and public spaces in order to strengthen the connections between people and shared places. At its core, placemaking is the concept of building communities around places”

Plan Implementation suggests priorities including: (pages 69-70)

- Tree replanting plan and diversification of species on public land should take into account, and not interfere with, potential garden locations
- Intergenerational programs with schools could include outdoor classrooms and community gardens
- Placemaking opportunities focused on food would be enhanced by community gardens in parks
