Re: Blackhawk Water Tower

My attorney and I have been longtime volunteers and members of Friends of Capitol Springs, a group that works to improve the Nine Springs E-Way. The E-Way is a seven mile natural corridor starting at Lake Farm Park, on the shores of Lake Waubesa, west to Dunns Marsh along Seminole Highway. The E stands for educational, ecological, exercise, esthetic and environmental. Since we have had this experience, we applaud the Friends of Pope Conservancy for their accomplishments. We understand their concerns regarding the Blackhawk water tower.

The Blackhawk tower will be sited on City of Madison property at the corner of W. Old Sauk Rd. and Pioneer Rd. Initially, three sites were identified, #1, #2 and #3. As owner of the property directly south of the proposed sites, we wanted the tower sited as close to W. Old Sauk Rd. as possible and selected site #3 as the most acceptable. Sometime later, the folks from Pope Farm Conservancy decided that site # 2 was the only site that was not in their view shed for photographers. We then suggested that site # 2 could possibly be moved north parallel to #3. This suggestion has created a discussion of a site #4 which would seem to address the concerns of both the Friends of Pope Farm Conservancy and us. Placement close to W. Old Sauk Rd. could cut project costs.

Prior to the current discussion, I had conversations with Mr. Pope regarding the tower. He thanked me for my involvement. Recently, Mr. Pope expressed an interest in moving the tower to the east. We can work together to achieve a solution that will be acceptable to all stakeholders. Hopefully, the Town of Middleton Town Board will give their approval to the new site #4 under consideration.

Thank you to all the folks for their patience and efforts.
