Try a Little Tenderness

OTIS REDDING MURAL

My name is Henrique Nardi. I am a Brazilian graphic designer and letterpress printer. I am also a design professor at the UW Art Department. Ever since I got to Wisconsin, I have this idea of creating a local artwork to honor Otis Redding. For this homage, I will be working in partnership with Criatipos, an art & design collective from Southern of Brazil, and local student members of the American Institute of Graphic Arts (AIGA).

In 2014, right after moving from São Paulo to Wisconsin, I learned that Otis Redding, "the king of the soul singers," died in a tragic plane crash in Madison. That was when I stepped into his Memorial at Monona Terrace.

The homage consists of a temporary mural depicting the phrase "Try A Little Tenderness," a reference to Redding's signature song.

The mural painting is scheduled for the first week of November when two members of Criatipo collective will be visiting Wisconsin to attend a graphic arts conference. Also, the Madison Arts Commission agreed to fund our project.

We believe that having a public artwork about Otis Redding in Madison is a great excuse to reconnect the city to the great American soul artist in an uplifting way while honoring his musical legacy.

It is also worth pointing out the favorable timing for this homage: 2016 is the year Otis Redding would be 75 years old, and 2017 will mark the 50th anniversary of his death.

Let's have good reasons to celebrate!
