Questions Regarding Transportation under Family Care in Dane County

The following are **draft** questions captured from, and subsequent to, the last Ad Hoc Committee meeting. These represent questions to be posed to staff representing the Family Care program.

- 1. How does someone qualify for transportation services under Family Care?
- 2. How does the RAD and outcomes effect transportation service authorization?
- 3. What are the qualifications for transportation service providers under Family Care?
- 4. What if Metro doesn't qualify as a transportation provider?
- 5. How is reimbursement to a transportation provider determined?
- 6. What are the mechanics of reimbursement?
- 7. As this is managed care, what limitations are there on cost sharing for transportation?
- 8. Would Metro be obligated to enter into an MCO agreement to become a Family Care transportation provider or could Metro present our Agency Fare Agreement?
- 9. How is the Family Care capitation rate determined?
- 10. How is the transition from CIP to Family Care or IRIS handled?
- 11. Is transportation an IRIS eligible service through waiver or another method?
- 12. What is the size of the waiting lists and how is the transition to Family Care and IRIS handled?
