## Madison Arts Commission Highlights 2016

## **Honors Event at Central Library**

Celebrating all those community artists and partner organizations that work together with MAC to advance arts and culture as an essential part of life in Madison.

## **Annual Grant Program**

MAC supports 55 artists and arts organizations through our annual grant program. Added two grant categories, specifically benefitting individual artists and pillar organizations.

### **Public Art**

- Established Sidewalk Poetry Program Installed six sidewalk poems in Marquette Neighborhood
- Installation of "**Updraft**" by Michael Burns in Brittingham Park as part of MAC's Art in Public Places program.
- Installation of "Wingra Waters" by Lisa Koch at the Monroe Street library.
- MAC continues to support efforts of the Regent Neighborhood Association who are commissioning "Shift" by Julia Schilling, a public art feature that will be installed under University Ave at Highland Avenue.
- A new **pavement painting** gets installed in Owl Creek.
- Draft language for a percent for art ordinance is ready for January introduction to the Common Council and Madison Arts Commission
- MAC funds and supports the creation of "Try a Little Tenderness" a mural homage to Otis Redding organized by Henrique Nardi.
- MAC authorizes a selection process for commissioning Public Art for the 700-800 block of State Street mall. A selection committee largely comprised of Public Art Standing Committee members selects RDG Dahlquist studios for the commission.
- MAC agrees to fund Art Write Collective's
  "You Are Beautiful" mural project at 1444 E. Washington.
- Private Developer of 316 W Washington commissioned large-scale 10-story waterfall mural for front of building.

## **BLINK Temporary Public Art**

- MAC pilots a utility box art-wrap project.
  Four test boxes by photographer Craig Wilson are installed on the Capital Square.
- MAC funds Michael Peterson and Laurie Beth Clark's "Feeding Farmers" Blink project at the MMoCA Wisconsin Triennial.
- Blink funds "Intentionally Welcoming Communities" sculptural installations near Union corners.
- MAC Blink artists were featured in a panel discussion at MMoCA titled "Art + Place."
- MAC supports 13 graduate student artists displaying temporary work at UW Arboretum with Blink funding
- Jeremy Nutall's "Rolling it Forward" is installed in Central Park near the skateboard park.
- MAC funds Faisal Abdu Allah's work with area at-risk youth to create neon signs that will be publicly displayed.
- MAC supports MUNICIPAL, a one-day popup exhibition at the Municipal Building prior to internal demolition and renovation.

### Conservation

- Work begins on City-owned Sid Boyum sculptures
- Cleaned and polishedthe Cap Square Fountains
- Work begins on major conservation effort for "Spirit of Greenbush" by Tony Testelin
- Community group forms to help save and restore the "Annie Stewart Fountain" near Vilas Zoo.
- Community group successfully raises funds to save the Sid Boyum house, increasing the likelihood that his self-taught artistic legacy will be preserved.
