Video surveillance will also be utilized. Bartenders are in charge of not over serving. Bartenders must complete a responsible beverage server-training course and be adept in alcohol laws, how to properly check IDs and conduct service practices that reduce excessive consumption for the safety of our staff, our patrons and our community.
