I can't make the plan commission meeting on 8/28 because I'm hosting a Darbo-Worthington pop-up Farmer & Flea Market planning meeting.

I'm excited about and support the plan! I just wanted to add a couple thoughts for the public record:

- I hope the plan will be flexible/adaptable as the newly reformed Worthington Park Neighborhood Association gets up to organizational capacity and begins acting as the voice for neighborhood resident wants/needs.
- We need bathrooms in Worthington Park. It's (literally) urgent. :) The Salvation Army does their best to accommodate neighborhood events but is often unable to have a staff person available to keep the building open after hours or hire extra janitorial staff to clean. There is no public restroom within reasonable walking distance. Hawthorne Library is too far for little kids. I've seen crying kids leave Community Carts events and even walked a young girl and her grandmother to my house a few blocks away during a recent Saturday Community Unity Arts event in the park. A community center/community space that would hopefully have a public restroom is years away. Meanwhile, is it possible to have one or two Port a Potties installed in Worthington Park that would be available throughout the open park season? There are so many great events being organized in the neighborhood that would benefit from public restrooms...
