Shiva Bidar-Sielaff noted that they started a conversation with the members of the Public Safety Review Committee (PSRC) on ways to review and strengthen their role in public safety: MGO 33.22: (4) Duties. The work of the Public Safety Review Committee shall be advisory to the Mayor and the Common Council to assist them in the performance of their statutory duties regarding the police and fire departments. The role of the Public Safety Review Committee shall in no way interfere with the lawfully prescribed powers and duties of the Common Council, the Police and Fire Commission, the Mayor, or the Chiefs of the respective Police or Fire Departments. The Public Safety Review Committee may, in the performance of its duties: (a) Review service priorities and capital budget priorities of the Police and Fire departments; (b) Serve as liaison between the community and the City on public safety issues; (c) Review annually and make recommendations to the Mayor and the Common Council regarding the annual work plans and long-range goals of the departments. Deb Julian, chair of PSRC, spoke to the committee about her frustrations with vacancies and the committee not being included in public safety discussions. CCEC members requested that PSRC develop a strategic plan, and if they want changes to their duties, bring those to the Common Council for discussion, review and possible action. This remainder of the discussion item was re-referred to the COMMON COUNCIL EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE (Policy governing the purchase & use of all surveillance equipment employed by all City agencies including MPD).
