Dear Ms. Burse;

The two-lot Certified Survey Map re-dividing two existing platted lots at 9809-9901 Silicon Prairie Parkway, Section 28, Township 7N, Range 8E, City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, is hereby **conditionally approved**. The subject property is zoned IL (Industrial–Limited District) The conditions of approval from the reviewing agencies to be satisfied prior to final approval and recording of the CSM are:

Please contact Tim Troester of the City Engineering Division at 267-1995 if you have questions regarding the following four (4) items:

- 1. The applicant shall dedicate 20-foot easement for public bike path purposes over the 20-foot sanitary easement along the south lot line of Lot 1. Include easement extension south between south line of easement to Lot 1 lot line for 20 feet wide, lined up with 20-foot easement dedicated on 1000 Oaks plat.
- 2. All outstanding Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) charges are due and payable prior to City Engineering Division sign-off, unless otherwise collected with a Developer's/ Subdivision Contract. Contact Mark Moder (608-261-9250) to obtain the final MMSD billing a minimum of two (2) working days prior to requesting City Engineering signoff of the CSM.
- 3. A minimum of two (2) working days prior to requesting City Engineering signoff on the CSM the applicant shall contact Tim Troester at 261-1995 (ttroester@cityofmadison.com) or Brenda Stanley at 261-9127 (bstanley@cityofmadison.com) to obtain the final stormwater utility charges that are due and payable prior to sub-division of the properties. The stormwater utility charges (as all utility charges) are due for the previous months of service. All charges shall be cleared prior to the land division (and subsequent obsolesces of the existing parcel).
- 4. The following note shall be added to the Certified Survey Map: "All lots created by this certified survey map are individually responsible for compliance with Chapter 37 of Madison General Ordinances in regard to stormwater management (oil/grease control only) at the time they develop."

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Please contact Jeff Quamme of the City Engineering Division–Mapping Section at 266-4097 if you have questions regarding the following twelve (12) items:

- 5. Remove the first note referencing Document No. 517425. The easement is further to the east away from lands within this CSM.
- 6. The applicant or the applicant's surveyor shall determine if Document No. 2665417 does in fact encumber lands within this property. If not, the second item under Note 3 on sheet 2 shall be removed.
- Remove the reference to CSM 9957 in the notes; it serves no purpose. Also remove the reference to Document No. 3520769. Any documents that do not encumber the CSM shall not be referenced on the CSM.
- 8. Add note 9 from the plat of Silicon Prairie Business Park to the CSM notes and refer the note to the plat.
- 9. Public improvements serving these lands have been constructed. Applicant shall work with City Engineering to release the DCCR recorded as Document No. 3718618. If released, the note referencing this restriction shall be removed from the CSM.
- 10. Remove the note referencing the Distribution Easement Underground per Document No. 4412905 as it does not encumber this CSM.
- 11. Add text to the note that addresses the Stormwater Maintenance per Document No. 5328426 that this document only encumbers Lot 1 of this Certified Survey Map.
- 12. Change the line types for the Storm Water Management and Sanitary Sewer Easement to something other than the type used for the existing Utility Easements.
- 13. Correct the header on all sheets. All of Lot 11 is included in the Certified Survey Map.
- 14. Wisconsin Administrative Code A-E 7.08 identifies when Public Land System (PLS) tie sheets must be filed with the Dane County Surveyor's office. The Developer's Surveyor and/or Applicant must submit copies of required tie sheets or monument condition reports for all monuments, including center of sections of record, used in this survey, to Jeff Quamme, City Engineering Division (jrquamme@cityofmadison.com). If a new tie sheet is not required under A-E 7.08, Engineering requests a copy of the latest tie sheet on record with Dane County Surveyor's office and shall be attached to a signed and sealed monument condition report. The Applicant shall identify monument types on all PLS corners included on the Plat or CSM. Note: Land tie to two PLS corners required.
- 15. In accordance with Section s. 236.18(8), Wisconsin Statutes, the applicant shall reference City of Madison WCCS Dane Zone, 1997 Coordinates on all PLS corners on the Certified Survey Map in areas where this control exists. The surveyor shall identify any deviation from City Master Control with recorded and measured designations. City of Madison has established WCCS, Dane Zone Coordinates on all PLS corners within its corporate boundary. Visit the Dane County Surveyor's Office (web address https://www.countyofdane.com/PLANDEV/records/surveyor.aspx) for current tie sheets and control

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data that has been provided by the City of Madison. If a surveyor encounters an area without a published WCCS Dane Zone 1997 value, contact the City Engineering Division for this information.

- 16. The applicant shall submit to Jeff Quamme, prior to Engineering sign-off of the subject plat, one (1) digital CADD drawing and one (1) signed copy of the final plat/CSM to the Mapping/GIS Section of the Engineering Division either as hard copy or Adobe pdf format. The digital CADD file shall be submitted in the WisDOT County Coordinate System, Dane County Zone datum in either Auto CAD Version compatible with MicroStation Version V8i, MicroStation Version V8i or older or Universal DXF Formats. The digital CADD file(s) shall contain the minimum of the items stated below, each on a separate layer name/level number. All line work shall be void of gaps and overlaps that would cause any parcel, street or easement to not properly close. All line work orientation and geometrics shall match the dimensioning as labeled on the final recorded plat: a.) Right-of-Way lines (public and private); b) Lot lines; c) Lot numbers; d) Lot/Plat dimensions; e) Street names; and f) Easement lines (i.e. street, sanitary, storm (including wetland and floodplain boundaries) water, pedestrian/ bike/ walkway, or any public and/or private interest easement except local service for Cable TV, gas, electric and fiber optics).
 - * This transmittal is a separate requirement from the required Engineering Streets Section for design purposes. The developer/surveyor shall submit new updated final plat, electronic data and a written notification to Engineering Mapping for any changes to the plat which occur subsequent to any original submittal of data and prior to final sign off..

- 17. All ownership consents and certifications for the subject lands shall conform to Wis. Stats. 236.21(2) and 236.29 by including the language "...surveyed, divided, mapped and <u>dedicated</u>..."
- 18. The 2016 real estate taxes are paid for the subject property. Per 236.21(3) Wis. Stats. and 16.23(5)(g)(1) Madison General Ordinances, the property owner shall pay all real estate taxes that are accrued or delinquent for the subject property prior to CSM recording. This includes property tax bills for the prior year that are distributed at the beginning of the year.
- 19. There are special assessments reported on the 9809 parcel. All special assessments are due and payable prior to CSM approval sign-off pursuant to MGO Section 16.23(5)(g)1.
- 20. Pursuant to MGO Section 16.23(5)(g)(4), the owner shall furnish an updated title report to Heidi Radlinger in City's Office of Real Estate Services (hradlinger@cityofmadison.com), as well as the survey firm preparing the proposed CSM. The report shall search the period subsequent to the date of the initial title commitment (July 11, 2017) submitted with the CSM application and include all associated documents that have been recorded since the initial title report. The surveyor shall update the CSM with the most recent information reported in the title update.
- 21. The owner shall email the document number of the recorded CSM to Heidi Radlinger as soon as the recording information is available.

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22. If all parties of interest agree that certain easements from prior plats or CSMs of record are no longer necessary, the release documents for said easements shall be recorded prior to CSM approval signoff, with the recording information for the release included as a Note on the proposed CSM.

Specific questions regarding the comments or conditions contained in this letter should be directed to the commenting agency.

A resolution approving the CSM and authorizing the City to sign it and any other documents related to the proposed land division was approved by the Common Council at its October 3, 2017 meeting.

As soon as the comments and conditions have been satisfied as verified with a completed affidavit form (attached), the original along with the revised Certified Survey Map, with all signatures and approvals from the reviewing agencies, shall be brought to this office for final signoff. You or your client may then record the certified survey at the Dane County Register of Deeds. For information on recording procedures and fees, contact the Register of Deeds at 266-4141.

Prior to City Engineering final sign-off by the main office of the CSM, the final CSM shall be submitted to the Engineering Division Surveyor/ Land Records Coordinator for final technical review and approval. This submittal must occur a minimum of two working days prior to final Engineering Division signoff. E-mail submittal of the final CSM in PDF form is preferred. Transmit to jrquamme@cityofmadison.com.

Any appeal from this action, including the conditions of approval, must be filed with the Circuit Court within 30 days from the date of this letter. The approval of this CSM shall be null and void if not recorded in twelve (12) months from the date of the approving resolution or this letter, whichever is later.
