
Project FOOD ACCESS IMPROVEMENT

The City of Madison aims to reduce food insecurity for its residents and improve their health. (2014)

The aim was addressed using a Food 'System' approach

- Benefit the population more in need,
- Have the opportunity to make the greatest impact,
- Focus multiple programs in specific geographic areas
- Areas of Focus within the city were geographically identified. The first official Food Access Improvement Map (FAIM) was created
- Common Council approved the FAIM in Summer 2015

- The first program to explore having an evaluation plan
- During development of the plan, the need to refine the FAIM emerged

- New boundaries City of Madison only
- ► NRT 2014 boundaries
- New scale : Census Block groups- CBG

New Dataset

- USDA 2015- Food Atlas CT Low Income-Low Access (1 mile)
- CBGs <u>within</u> the City boundaries.
- NIP 2015 Neighborhood Indicators at the CBG level
