Dear Mr. Adams and Mr. Prieve:

The two-lot Certified Survey Map of property located at 1809 W. Beltline Highway, Section 34, Township 7N, Range 9E, City of Madison, Dane County, Wisconsin, is hereby **conditionally approved**. The property is zoned CC (Commercial Corridor District). The conditions of approval from the reviewing agencies to be satisfied prior to final approval and recording of the CSM are:

- 1. The Applicant shall construct sidewalk to a plan approved by the City.
- 2. All outstanding Madison Metropolitan Sewerage District (MMSD) charges are due and payable prior to Engineering sign-off, unless otherwise collected with a Developer's / Subdivision Contract. Contact Mark Moder (608-261-9250) to obtain the final MMSD billing a minimum of two (2) working days prior to requesting City Engineering signoff. (MGO16.23(9)(d)(4)
- 3. A minimum of two (2) working days prior to requesting City Engineering signoff on the plat/csm the applicant shall contact either Tim Troester at 261-1995 (ttroester@cityofmadison.com) or Brenda Stanley at 608-261-9127 (bstanley@cityofmadison.com) to obtain the final stormwater utility charges that are due and payable prior to sub-division of the properties. The stormwater utility charges (as all utility charges) are due for the previous months of service. All charges shall be cleared prior to the land division (and subsequent obsolesces of the existing parcel). (POLICY)
- 4. The following note shall be placed on the CSM: No changes in drainage patterns associated with development on any or all lots within this CSM shall be allowed without prior approval of the City Engineer. Proposed Lot 1 will continue to accept drainage from the lot to the south.
- 5. The construction of this project will require that the applicant shall enter into a City / Developer agreement for the required infrastructure improvements. The applicant shall contact City Engineering to schedule the development of the plans and the agreement. The City Engineer will not sign off on this project without the agreement executed by the developer. Obtaining a developer's agreement generally takes approximately 4-6 weeks, minimum. (MGO 16.23(9)c)

- 6. The approval of this zoning approval does not include the approval of the changes to roadways, sidewalks or utilities. The applicant shall obtain separate approval by the Board of Public Works and the Common Council for the restoration of the public right of way including any changes requested by developer. The City Engineer shall complete the final plans for the restoration with input from the developer. (MGO16.23(9)(d)(6)
- 7. All work in the public right-of-way shall be performed by a City licensed contractor. (MGO 16.23(9)(c)5) and MGO 23.01)
- 8. All damage to the pavement on W Beltline Hwy, adjacent to this development shall be restored in accordance with the City of Madison's Pavement Patching Criteria. For additional information please see the following link: http://www.cityofmadison.com/engineering/patchingCriteria.cfm (POLICY)

Please contact Jeff Quamme of the Engineering Division—Mapping Section at (608) 266-4097 if you have questions regarding the following fourteen (14) items:

- 9. Applicant shall provide a copy and reference on this CSM a recorded access agreement tha provides for access between this CSM and the two parcels in the Town of Madison at 2810 Bryant Road and 1801 W. Beltline Highway.
- 10. A draft of the reciprocal easement for vehicular access, parking, pedestrian access, private storm sewer and storm water surface drainage shall be provided between Lot 1 and Lot 2 of this Certified Survey Map. This shall be recorded immediately after the Certified Survey Map has been recorded.
- 11. The detail of Lot 1 on sheet 2 shall show the chords for the two curves as required by statute.
- 12. The east right of way of Eggiman Road intersecting the south line of this CSM shall be monumented and dimensioned as required by Statute.
- 13. Provide tangent bearings at each end of each curve as required by statute. Show the width from the right of way to the reference line of the frontage road. Label the reference line for the frontage Road.
- 14. Wisconsin Administrative Code A-E 7.08 identifies when Public Land System (PLS) tie sheets must be filed with the Dane County Surveyor's office. The Developer's Surveyor and/or Applicant must submit copies of required tie sheets or monument condition reports for all monuments, including center of sections of record, used in this survey, to Jeff Quamme, City Engineering (irquamme@cityofmadison.com). If a new tie sheet is not required under A-E 7.08, Engineering requests a copy of the latest tie sheet on record with Dane County Surveyor's office and shall be attached to a signed and sealed monument condition report. The Applicant shall identify monument types on all PLS corners included on the Plat or CSM. Note: Land tie to two PLS corners required.
- 15. In accordance with Section s. 236.18(8), Wisconsin Statutes, the Applicant shall reference City of Madison WCCS Dane Zone, 1997 Coordinates on all PLS corners on the Plat or Certified Survey Map in areas where this control exists. The Surveyor shall identify any deviation from City Master

Control with recorded and measured designations. City of Madison has established WCCS, Dane Zone Coordinates on all PLS corners within its corporate boundary. Visit the Dane County Surveyor's Office (web address:

https://www.countyofdane.com/PLANDEV/records/surveyor.aspx) for current tie sheets and control data that has been provided by the City of Madison. If a surveyor encounters an area without a published WCCS Dane Zone 1997 value, contact Engineering Division for this information.

- 16. The Applicant shall submit to Jeff Quamme, prior to Engineering sign-off of the subject plat, one (1) digital CADD drawing and one (1) signed copy of the final plat/CSM to the Mapping/GIS Section of the Engineering Division either as hard copy or Adobe pdf format. The digital CADD file shall be submitted in the WISDOT County Coordinate System, Dane County Zone datum in either Auto CAD Version compatible with MicroStation Version V8i, MicroStation Version V8i or older or Universal DXF Formats. The digital CADD file(s) shall contain the minimum of the items stated below, each on a separate layer name/level number. All line work shall be void of gaps and overlaps that would cause any parcel, street or easement to not properly close. All line work orientation and geometrics shall match the dimensioning as labeled on the final recorded plat:
 - a. Right-of-Way lines (public and private)
 - b. Lot lines
 - c. Lot numbers
 - d. Lot/Plat dimensions
 - e. Street names
 - f. Easement lines (i.e. street, sanitary, storm (including wetland & floodplain boundaries) water, pedestrian/bike/walkway, or any public and/or private interest easement except local service for Cable TV, gas, electric and fiber optics).

NOTE: This Transmittal is a separate requirement from the required Engineering Streets Section for design purposes. The Developer/Surveyor shall submit new updated final plat, electronic data and a written notification to Engineering Mapping for any changes to the plat which occur subsequent to any original submittal of data and prior to final sign off.

- 17. Prior to Engineering final sign-off by main office for Plats or Certified Survey Maps (CSM), the final Plat or CSM must be submitted to Engineering Division Surveyor / Land Records Coordinator for final technical review and approval. This submittal must occur a minimum of two working days prior to final Engineering Division sign- off. Electronic mail submittal of the FINAL Plat or CSM in PDF form is preferred. Transmit to irquamme@cityofmadison.com
- 18. Provide a recorded as distance of 264' along the south boundary of the CSM.
- 19. Remove the reference to Dane County subdivision regulations and replace with City of Madison subdivision regulations in the Surveyor's Certificate.
- 20. Add a degree symbol to the bearing in the tie from the section corner in the legal description under the Surveyor's Certificate.

- 21. The westerly centerline curve is concaved incorrectly along with the adjoiner right of way to the west. Correct this on all maps.
- 22. Correct all dates of 2017 to leave a blank or to 2018.

- 23. Signature block certifications shall be executed by all parties of interest having the legal authority to do so, pursuant to Wis. Stats. 236.21(2)(a). Said parties shall provide documentation of legal signing authority to the notary at the time of execution. The title of each certificate shall be consistent with the ownership interest reported in the most recent title report. The executed original hard stock recordable CSM shall be presented at the time of sign-off.
- 24. A certificate of consent for all mortgagees/vendors shall be executed prior to CSM approval sign-off.
- 25. A Consent of Lessee certificate shall be executed prior to CSM approval sign-off.
- 26. As of <u>December 28, 2017</u>, the 2017 real estate taxes are due for the subject property. The tax amount for the entire year shall be paid in full prior to CSM approval sign-off pursuant to 236.21(3) Wis. Stats. and 16.23(5)(g)(1) Madison General Ordinances. Receipts from the City of Madison Treasurer are to be provided before or at the time of sign-off. Payment is made to:

- 27. As of <u>December 28, 2017</u>, there are no special assessments reported. All known special assessments are due and payable prior to CSM approval sign-off. If special assessments are levied against the property during the review period and prior to CSM approval sign-off, they shall be paid in full pursuant to Madison General Ordinance Section 16.23(5)(g)1.
- 28. Pursuant to Madison City Ordinance Section 16.23(5)(g)(4), the owner shall furnish an updated title report to Jenny Frese in City's Office of Real Estate Services (ifrese@cityofmadison.com), as well as the survey firm preparing the proposed CSM. The report shall search the period subsequent to the date of the initial title report (11-30-17) submitted with the CSM application and include all associated documents that have been recorded since the initial title report. Surveyor shall update the CSM with the most recent information reported in the title update.

Specific questions regarding the comments or conditions contained in this letter should be directed to the commenting agency.

A resolution approving the CSM and authorizing the City to sign it and any other documents related to the proposed land division was approved by the Common Council on January 16, 2018.

As soon as the comments and conditions have been satisfied as verified with a completed affidavit form (attached), the original along with the revised Certified Survey Map, with all signatures and approvals from the reviewing agencies, shall be brought to this office for final signoff. You or your client may then

record the certified survey at the Dane County Register of Deeds. For information on recording procedures and fees, contact the Register of Deeds at (608) 266-4141.

Prior to City Engineering final sign-off by the main office of the CSM, the final CSM shall be submitted to the Engineering Division Surveyor/ Land Records Coordinator for final technical review and approval. This submittal must occur a minimum of two working days prior to final Engineering Division signoff. E-mail submittal of the final CSM in PDF form is preferred. Transmit to jrquamme@cityofmadison.com.

Any appeal from this action, including the conditions of approval, must be filed with the Circuit Court within 30 days from the date of this letter. The approval of this CSM shall be null and void if not recorded in twelve (12) months from the date of the approving resolution or this letter, whichever is later.
