Thank you again for the meeting this week regarding the Grandview Commons proposals. It was mentioned at the meeting that we could email our concerns and they would get passed on in time for the approval meetings next week. I'm hoping this is the appropriate channel for that.

My concern is that the biggest take away from the meeting was that North Star Drive needs to go through to Milwaukee Street first and that will cure everything. Having North Star Drive go through to Milwaukee Street as soon as possible will certainly help some of the other traffic problems in the neighborhood, but it still doesn't make Galileo Drive going all the way through to Milwaukee Street a good idea.

I live on the corner of Dominion Drive and Galileo Drive. Galileo Drive is the closest north/south running street that takes you to the Metro Market and if that road goes all the way through from Milwaukee Street it will certainly become an even busier street than it's already become. This route to the grocery store also takes you right past a park where the streets are narrow surrounding it.

Galileo Drive was not originally designed to be a main thoroughfare so it's not as wide as the other streets and has no round abouts/traffic calming measures planned like Milky Way and North Star Drive. Speed bumps are not a good option because it takes away any parking in front of the residents homes along those bumps. Many residents also have to back out of their driveways onto Galileo, which doesn't happen on North Star Drive because those homes all have the garage in the back of the home on an alley/carriage lane access.

There are 3 other roads currently planned that will go through the neighborhood from Milwaukee Street in a span of less than 1/2 mile. Adding a 4th option will do more harm than good. There's only 3 roads coming into the neighborhood along the 1 mile long stretch of Sprecher Road that is the east border of this neighborhood. There's also 4 roads coming through the neighborhood off of Cottage Grove Road (the south border of the neighborhood) but those streets are only a couple of blocks long, except for North Star Drive, and were planned well to prevent traffic from speeding all the way through the neighborhood. Galileo would be a street closer to 1 mile long so giving access directly off Milwaukee Street will provide much more of an opportunity for drivers to increase their speed as they travel along.

There seems to be no benefit to having Galileo Drive go all the way through to Milwaukee Street and there would certainly be many potential negative outcomes. I hope you'll reconsider and choose to keep plan A as presented by Veridian with Galileo Drive not extending all the way out to Milwaukee Street.

Dear Representatives and City Officials:

I'd like to register my strong opposition to extending Galileo Drive to Milwaukee Street.

I live on Dominion Drive, two houses from the intersection of Dominion and Galileo, where I've seen a number of drivers coast through the stop signs in place on Dominion. There is a slight hill on Galileo, coming from the north toward the Dominion intersection, and cars get going at well-above legal speeds on this decline. In addition, the houses are positioned so close to the intersection, that this is really a blind intersection, meaning that cars that miss or ignore stop signs on Dominion may not have time to react to cars speeding along Galileo Drive.

In addition, as the parent of an elementary and middle school student, I can tell you that there are public school bus stops along Galileo and Dominion, as well as a number of children who cross at Dominion and Galileo from other stops. Adding cars that are speeding to cut through the neighborhood to the mix could have very tragic consequences, not only for children, but for all cyclists and pedestrians.

Finally, when we purchased our home in this location, we had expectations about where roads would be positioned around us, based on maps shared with us by Veridian. There was a plan in place and we expected and counted on that plan being realized. Changing this up after so many of us have purchased homes here with these expectations feels like a bait and switch on behalf of Veridian (and the City of Madison).

This is a bad, dangerous, and unfair proposition, and I hope you'll oppose it on behalf of the residents who live, work, and play here every day.

Hello Alder Hall!

I would like to provide some feedback regarding the Galileo Drive extension.

First off, I don't see how Galileo is a viable option as a through-street. Though slightly wider than some other roads, it still seems too narrow for the task. Galileo has a high density of houses, with cars interspersed on both sides – especially between Venus Way and Aires Way. All parking could be moved to one side of the road, but that would certainly be unwelcome news for those living on Galileo, and it would create a stream of moving traffic close to the sidewalk – and children – on one side. I personally would not be affected much by changes to Galileo. It simply appears to solve very little, while creating many new problems.

Secondly, would it not make sense to <u>immediately</u> extend North Star to Milwaukee Street as planned? Every time I see a bulldozer at the northern end of the neighborhood, I think to myself "Yes! The promised 'real' route to Milwaukee Street is coming at last!" Is there some super extra cost to completing it now, as opposed to later? Perhaps North Star alone would be enough to meet future traffic needs. And much of the current traffic on Galileo could be because it does technically connect to Milwaukee Street – albeit in a very "turn left, turn right, turn left, turn right, …" kind of way. I personally am one of those using Galileo to get to Milwaukee Street. But it is for two reasons only: (1) My house is closest to the alley exit onto Galileo; and (2) North Star currently provides no better access to Milwaukee Street than does Galileo. Build the remaining section of North Star, and I will come. I promise my fellow neighbors that I will avoid unnecessary future use of Galileo.

Lastly, there is one potential easy, cost-effective alteration to Galileo that should be performed, regardless of current traffic volume: Reverse the stop-signs (or add another set) at the intersection of Dominion Drive and Galileo. Currently, traffic on Dominion must stop for traffic on Galileo. It seems counter-intuitive/unexpected, possibly because Dominion is more of a main through-street.

I've heard this from others as well. I've witnessed many drivers blindly cruise up/down Galileo, through that intersection, as I am approaching on Dominion. Conversely, I've seen other drivers on Dominion who clearly expected me to stop as I (slowly) passed through on Galileo. Approaching from either direction, I always have one foot hovering over the brake pedal.

My apologies for the lengthy email. But I thank you for your time!

We ultimately decided to buy in The Grandview Commons neighborhood and on Galileo Dr. I am JUST reading about plans/ proposals to make Galileo Dr a through street and connect to Milwaukee St. First, I am upset about the lack of information to the residence about this consideration. Being a homeowner in the Grandview Commons neighborhood and a homeowner on Galileo Dr this is upsetting to me. A heads up on a meeting with the ones who will have to deal with the final decisions and outcome would be nice and more importantly should happen. I would hope this would be something you could have a discussion about at a later date, once more information is available to the ones who

own and live in the affected areas.

I strongly disagree with this change. Some of our concerns are as follows:

1. The excess traffic this would bring to our street.

2. The street is not wide enough to handle this kind of traffic. Dear Alderperson Hall,

First, thank you for arranging the meeting Jan. 31 to discuss the extension of Galileo Drive to the north of the existing roadway, with possible connection directly to Milwaukee Street.

We attended the meeting and, after hearing the presentations and audience comments, **wish to convey our support for the eventual connection to Milwaukee Street.** Please forward our position to the Plan Commission.

Our reasons include:

- Additional access to the Grandview Commons and Grandview North neighborhoods, providing more travel options for residents
- Possibly reducing the traffic burden borne by North Star (which will still be the main north-south route) by spreading it out somewhat to other streets in the development
- Added access points for public safety services, including police, fire and ambulance

We understand and are sympathetic to residents on Galileo who currently reside on a deadend street and do not wish to have more traffic coming past their homes. However, the development of this new plat, with approximately 180 new homes, and the extension of Galileo to the north will necessarily add traffic - regardless of whether the street connects to Milwaukee. Not making the connection to Milwaukee will NOT prevent the new residents from traveling down Galileo to the grocery store.

As you observed by the end of the meeting, there are several transportation and traffic concerns in the neighborhood. A few points:

- We agree with the gentleman who characterized the intersection of Dominion Drive with Galileo as "an accident waiting to happen." We live on Dominion and have seen cars, construction trucks, and other vehicles blow through that intersection without stopping. Dominion feels like the proper through street; many drivers are not expecting a stop sign there. One of us came close to being hit by a car while walking the dog across that intersection.
- Yield signs are needed on Pluto at the intersection with Dominion Drive. Common sense would indicate that drivers on Pluto would yield before turning onto Dominion, but we have observed otherwise.
- Some cars come through the round-about from North Star onto Dominion at very high speeds. It is bad enough that we advise visitors to our home (the first one past North Star on the south side of Dominion) <u>never</u> to park on Dominion, but rather around the corner on Pluto.
- Traffic calming techniques are needed on various streets, including Milky Way, throughout the Grandview development to slow traffic. There are many children in the neighborhood. We are aware that residents on North Star have many concerns about speeds of traffic on that roadway as well.

We conclude by thanking you once again for holding the meeting. We do believe that the city and Veridian are both working hard to ensure good development and traffic patterns for those of us who live here. If you have questions about any of the items expressed here, please feel free to contact us.

I write to let you know of my opposition to changing the development/zoning plans to make Galileo Drive a through street.

As you know, Galileo Drive was not originally designed to be a main thoroughfare so it's not as wide as the other streets and has no round abouts/traffic calming measures planned like Milky Way and North Star Drive. Speed bumps are not a good option because it takes away any parking in front of the residents homes along those bumps. Many residents also have to back out of their driveways onto Galileo, which doesn't happen on North Star Drive because those homes all have the garage in the back of the home on an alley/carriage lane access.

There are 3 other roads currently planned that will go through the neighborhood from Milwaukee Street in a span of less than 1/2 mile. There's only 3 roads coming into the neighborhood along the 1 mile long stretch of Sprecher Road that is the east border of this neighborhood. There's also 4 roads coming through the neighborhood off of Cottage Grove Road (the south border of the neighborhood) but those streets are only a couple of blocks long, except for North Star Drive, and were planned to prevent traffic from speeding all the way through the neighborhood. Galileo would be a street closer to 1 mile long so giving access directly off Milwaukee Street will provide much more of an opportunity for drivers to increase their speed as they travel along - again on a much narrower street. There seems to be no benefit to having Galileo Drive go all the way through to Milwaukee Street and there would certainly be many potential negative outcomes.

For all of the above reasons, please do not change the zoning and allow Galileo to become a through street.

I am a resident of Grand View Commons since March of 2006 and built my home here. I have great concern for the possible plan to make Galileo go through to Milwaukee Street.

My concern is from a traffic safety perspective and I am in the field of traffic safety education with state and national organization awards for recognition directly related to my efforts and commitment to the field of making drivers and communities safer on the roads.

If the plan were to go through, the homes on Galileo have street facing driveways in which homeowners would have to back onto the major through street or back into their driveways/garages. Both of these are dangerous especially with the concern with speeding.

I live on Apollo Way which has become a frequent speeding street with residents from the apartments, which are at the East end of Apollo Way. One vehicle actually lost control a few years ago and ended up in my front yard after he/she knocked out my street side mailbox, it was a hit and run. There have been near collisions which I have witnessed on Apollo Way on the north side of the street which has street side driveways because drivers are speeding on Apollo Way.
