For the event in Madison I will be collaborating with Chef Maggie Roovers of Fourquarter on a summer menu sourcing from local producers that she has existing relationships with.

The Story

I am an artist that works in many mediums. This piece involves all of us and the "art" tonight is our social interaction. The menu is Analyn's creation, responding to specific guidelines. I gave her a list of foods that contain one or more of these nutrients:

Nitrogen, Protein, Sodium, Calcium, Phosphate, Iron, and Chloride.

These nutrients are the building blocks of human life, of you and me. They are the very components that build our skeletons, string our muscles, fire our nerve endings, and make our blood flow.

This is the nourishment that we each shared with our mothers in the womb. This is the potential energy that lies dormant in every birthing body. It gets discarded every month if there's no baby.

These are the ingredients of menstrual blood.
