Dear Plan Commission Members;

Design Shelters LLC, on behalf of Steven Fauska, the owner of a property located at 2500 Waunona Way, is submitting this letter of intent as a part of a conditional use permit application. Mr. Fauska, the long time owner and occupant of this property has decided that it is time to demolish the current structure and build a modern single family home in which he can live for the rest of his life. The existing structure is an 1890 era ice house which has been added onto and enlarged several times in its 120 plus year existence. Needless to say, the home is sub-standard in terms of modern construction methods and efficiencies.

We want to demolish the existing structure and the detached garage and build Mr. Fauska a code compliant, modern, 2-story home with an attached garage.

The lot coverage we are proposing is 35.17% (4,141 sq ft). Well under the maximum allowed lot coverage of 50%. The lot is not in the FEMA flood plain. Our plan includes 7.634 sq ft. of usable open space.

- 7. The proposed improvements will conform to all of the applicable regulations of the district
