MPD PSRC JULY REPORT

Shots Fired from June (2018).

There were 13 reported shots fired calls for service last month. Through the end of June (2018), there have been 101 shots fired calls. For the first 6-months of last year there were 95 shots fired calls recorded; thus we saw a 6.3% increase this year from last year.

A break-down of shots fired for June per district:

North: 6

• East: 3

West: 1

South: 2

Central: 0

Midtown: 1

Of the shots fired calls, 4 properties were found with damage from gunfire (36 properties year-to-date) and 2 subjects were struck by gunfire (11 year-to-date). We also recovered 86 casings in June (349 year-to-date) when responding to shots fired calls.

Stolen Autos

In June (2018) we took **38 reports of stolen autos**; **32** of these vehicles have since been recovered. In June (2017), there were **27 reports of stolen autos**; thus last month we saw a 41% increase.

Of the 38 vehicles stolen, **36 had keys inside of them!** It was also noted that 2 of the stolen vehicles were left unlocked, unoccupied and running.

Where did the auto thefts occur per district in June?

West: 20

South: 3

Central: 1

North: 4

Midtown: 6

East: 4

We have had **201 stolen autos** already this year. Last year, at this time, we had 169, so we are up **18.9%**.

Heroin OD'S

June 2018.....projected to be the **WORST MONTH EVER** in the City of Madison for **heroin** deaths and the second worst for overdoses.

There were 35 known overdoses in June (2018). In June (2017) there were 9; thus we saw a 289% increase.

There were 11 suspected deaths from heroin overdoses in June (2018). In June (2017) there were 2; thus we saw a 450% increase!

What we know about this heroin epidemic from June -

- 2 subjects who overdosed where homeless; neither is one of the 11 fatalities.
- 3 subjects were found eligible and referred to the Madison Addiction Recovery Initiative (MARI); all 3 have at least called to set up an assessment.
- Approximately 10 of the overdoses occurred in places of business; several others occurred in parking lots or streets.
- 26-of-the-35-subjects-experiencing-an-overdose-were-males.
- 25 of the 35 subjects experiencing an overdose were in their 20's or 30's.
