



Goodman South Madison Library New Teen Space Design Challenge

Designing Teen Spaces

Fofor two days on January 30 and February 1, teenagers took over the Goodman Library from 4-7 pm as they excepted, planned, dialogued and dreamed about the perfect teen space at the Goodman Library New Teen Space Design Challenge, facilitated by Madison's very own Hip-Hop Architect, Michael Ford. Using existing floor plans, LEGO's, card-board furniture cut-outs, colored stickle pads, colored pencils and plenty of imagination and purpose these motivated young people put in work that will pay off for them in the end.

The first workshop was held on Jan 30th and and the pizza and refreshments the youth went to work. A scavenger hunt gave them the opportunity to explore the existing library, counting chains, bookshelves, tables and other furniture to determine how the space could best be configured to allow them to have a more satisfying library experience. A promise of a gift card to the first team to come close to the octual numbers, motivated some, but most were enjoying the opportunity and it became clear early on

The following day high school students were lead through a similar exercise and a handful of middle school students returned for round two.

Unfortunately, we won't install all of their ideas, but it gives them some insight into what goes into planning for the space and a sense of ownership once it is












2018 FLOORING PLAN







