# Parking Utility Overview

The Parking Utility Builds, maintains, and operates on-street and off-street public parking infrastructure and establishes policy and procedure to manage the public parking system in concert with City-wide transportation goals and policy.

#### Four Services:

- 1. Garage Parking: 5 garages (Frances & Lake counted as 1) totaling ~ 3,700 spaces.
  - S. Livingston Street Garage (6<sup>th</sup> garage) will add ~ 650 spaces, opening late 2018.
- 2. Lot Parking: 6 parking lots ~ 450 spaces combined.
- **3. On-Street Parking:** 1400 metered spaces, on-street loading zones, accessible parking, administer permit parking programs- including Residential Parking Permit Program.
- 4. Parking Operations (Admin): overall management of operations, financials, and policy

  - Brayton Lot
  - Buckeye Lot

#### **PARKING EQUIPMENT**

• Access control system for permit parkers (proximity cards)



- Protect Revenues and Infrastructure
- Customer Service
- Security/Safety
- Operations
- Incident Review


## Cameras – Where?

**Exit and Entry Gates** – help line calls, collecting for damages (vehicles driving through gates to avoid paying), revenue equipment theft/damage prevention, queuing and operations

**Pay-on-Foot Stations**– help line calls, revenue equipment theft/damage prevention, patron safety

## Cameras – Where? Continued

**Rooftops**– security and operations

- Visual cue that garage is approaching full
- Security check on safety (contact police) if person is wandering/loitering on rooftops or other suspicious behavior.

**Other locations** – crime prevention and law enforcement

- State Street Campus Garage
  - Hawthorne Court
  - Sidewalk and pedestrian entrance locations
  - Stairwells
  - Elevator areas

## Access to Cameras – Who and Capabilities

### <u>Who:</u>

- 27 Parking Utility Employees (Supervisors/Managers, Parking Revenue Leadworkers, Field office personnel, Parking Equipment Electrical Technician, Parking Equipment Mechanic I, and Parking Technical Aide)
- Access rights for other departments such as MPD determined by IT

#### <u>Can:</u>

- View live cameras
- Review up to past two weeks of video
- Change camera position for cameras that have ability to rotate (few). Most are fixed.

#### Cannot:

- Download/save/share video (requests to archive footage of an incident are sent to MPD)
- No audio capabilities
