- Anna and Cornelius Collins House, 646 E. Gorham Street (1993)
- Irene and Robert Conner House, 640 E. Gorham Street (1993)

A small portion of the site around the Gates of Heaven Synagogue is also located in the Mansion Hill local historic district.
