In writing to to ask the Madison City Plan Commission to vote yes and support the Edgewood High School Master Plan amendment, I offer three different perspectives with respect to this issue.

First, I live in the neighborhood in the triangle of Hillington Green. Second, I am a small business owner on Monroe Street. And third, I have a child who attends Edgewood High School, West High School and Blessed Sacrament School.

I have lived in Madison for 26 years and in this neighborhood for 13 years. It is a vibrant community hosting many neighborhood schools including West High School, Edgewood High School, Randall School, Wingra School, Blessed Sacrament School and is immediately adjacent to the University of Wisconsin and specifically Camp Randall Stadium and the Fieldhouse. This is a community of students, elementary, secondary and post secondary.

It is therefore incumbent upon us as their neighbors to show positive support for these schools which educate our students, the children of our neighbors, our children. We need to fully support those students not only in their academic but also in their whole person social development. This includes, in part, their extracurricular activities. Consequently, we should do whatever we possibly can to support the schools in their mission of developing ethical, mature, responsible, self-sufficient and productive adults. This amendment to their master plan is a reasonable and inherently consistent part of fulfilling this dimension of their mission.

We need to do whatever we reasonably can to provide these students with opportunities to feel socially engaged and to feel like they are truly a part of and welcomed by their community. In other words, it is important for us to be good neighbors to one another. Edgewood has been a good neighbor to this community for over 100 years. Supporting and approving this amendment to the Master Plan is Madison's opportunity to show that we are a good neighbor to Edgewood High School.

Edgewood has gone above and beyond in trying to accommodate those of us who are their neighbors. They have held listening sessions with neighbors and with the feedback have made several modifications to the Plan. They have been sensitive to the concerns of neighbors. The least we can do is to be accommodating in return in their desire to provide opportunities for their students to engage in extracurricular activities on their premises. To do otherwise is not neighborly. In fact, to do otherwise is discriminatory. How can we in good conscience allow the University to play football games, including some night games, at Camp Randall Stadium with 80,000 people and night games for volleyball and wrestling in the Fieldhouse and men and women's basketball and hockey games at the Kohl Center and then say no to Edgewood High School in their modest request. This would be a double standard, discriminatory and intolerant towards a longstanding good neighbor.

From the perspective of a small business owner on Monroe Street, having late afternoon and evening events at the high school is a win-win for the merchants and businesses on Monroe Street. Many of those who will attend the games at Edgewood will, before or afterwards, shop and enjoy food and drink at the local restaurants and eating establishments on and near Monroe Street. By approving this master plan, you also support those of us who are business owners on and near Monroe Street.

Finally, as a parent of an Edgewood student, I have personally seen the wonderful and tremendous value that the school brings to my child and all the children of our community who are educated there by providing strong academic formation, extracurricular programs as well as nurturing public service and community outreach all with the purpose of developing well rounded students who will be our future residents and leaders and who in turn we hope will give back to our community as good neighbors. What message do we send to the students if we reject the Master Plan amendment.

We are long-time Madison residents. Please use your best efforts to reconcile/resolve the Edgewood H.S. athletic field issue, as per below. Thank you. And yes, I definitely plan to attend the Jan. 14 meeting.

Yes, as half-century west-side Madison residents, we favor schools being able to hold school activities on-site. Including athletics. To paraphrase Daniel Webster, Edgewood is a small high school (< 1/4 enrollment of other city schools) but there are those who love it. It seems a bit odd to recommend approval of a pattern practiced world-wide, from time out of memory. But stranger things have occurred in Madison. So let's round-up the usual suspects.

First, <u>discontent</u>: It is clear that some EHS neighbors feel that their lives will not be enhanced by athletic events being held at EHS. They are good people, who deserve to be heard. Point taken.

Second, <u>history</u>: EHS has been "in the neighborhood" for over a century. Including athletic games dating back to the 1920s. EHS was part of the neighborhood before there was even a neighborhood. There isn't a neighbor alive today who recalls when athletic events were NOT held at EHS.

Third, <u>equity</u>: Other city high schools already practice what is being preached, namely have their athletic events held on-site space available. Employing brighter lights and creating more noise than EHS, by a long shot. Never mind Camp Randall, just down Monroe St. and also next to a "residential neighborhood." Strictly speaking, "no new stadium" is a non sequitur. EHS already has (and always has had) an athletic field. The only issue is whether it gets to use it. Sheesh.

Fourth, small groups & public policy: What role should next-door neighbors and interested parties play in city decision-making? Some assert a big role, e.g., neighborhood associations. But neither is it a slam-dunk. Small-groups of any stripe can be quite atypical, especially about policies affecting the overall city. Small groups are great for broadcasting anger. Rustle up some yard-signs, get some letters to the editor, etc. Weighing alternative issues and seeking a balanced city-wide view? Not so much. Speaking of which, what small group wouldn't adore a NIMBY/heckler's veto (aka "concerned citizens") and "broomstick through the bicycle spokes" leverage? A short (tiny?) list includes cops in the schools, lakefront property neighbors, homeless shelters, Confederate war memorials, and Tree Lane neighbors.

Summary: The Greek play Medea showed how bad stuff happens--and may persist--if anger is allowed to drive out judgment. Current politics does not lack for further examples. EHS neighbors are good people and deserve to have their voices heard. However, their concerns might also be seen to best operate as a shield, not a sword. Respectfully, let the "better angels of our nature" and other peoples' voices, also be heard. Balancing factors include a) the century-long history of EHS and its athletics, b) the major traffic artery called Monroe St., EHS or no, c) the common-sense of holding a reasonable # of EHS athletic events on-site, as per other Madison schools, and d) not letting anger eject informed public policy discussion and judgment. Of course, w/o letting these factors over-top the proper respect and accommodation due EHS neighbor noise concerns.
