Burglaries

We received 47 reports of burglaries in December (2018). Last year, during the month of December, there were 89 reported burglaries; (47% decrease)

Through the end of December, our community experienced 1,067 reported burglaries. In 2017 there were 919 reported burglaries; (16% increase)

At least 17 of the burglaries occurred when a resident was home

At least 21 of the burglaries occurred due to an unlocked door/open garage

No reports of handguns stolen

There were three vehicles stolen in the course of a burglary

Breakdown of burglaries per district from December:

West: 10

South: 4

Central: 8

North: 13

East: 4

Midtown: 8

Shots Fired

There were 14 reports of shots fired in December. In December (2017) there were also 14 reports of shots fired. There was a total of 186 shots fired calls in 2018. In 2017, there were 220 shots fired calls (15.5% decrease in 2018).

More information on the incidents from December (2018):

There were four reports of property damaged from shots fired (65 year-to-date)

- The incident at Vision's in December left four subjects shot/ricocheted (31 subjects struck year-to-date)
- Officers recovered 31 casings (534 year-to-date)
- Central District reported the most incidents (5), followed by North/West (3 each), East (2), South (1) and Midtown (0

Heroin Overdoses

- There were 10 known overdoses in December. This was the lowest month in all of 2018. In December (2017) there were 33 known overdoses; (69% decrease). There was a total of 275 known overdoses in 2018. In 2017, there were 259 known overdoses (6% increase). 2018 demographic data regarding overdoses 68% male, 32% female; 79% white, 17% African American, 3% Hispanic/Native American.
- In 2018, we lost 42 community members to suspected heroin overdose deaths. This is a 23% increase from 2017 where we had 34 heroin overdose related deaths. 2018 demographic data regarding these deaths 64% male, 36% female; 93% white, 3% African American.
- MPD Officers referred two community members to the Madison Addiction Recovery Initiative (MARI) program in December. Since the beginning of MARI, twenty-four community members have completed the program, with several more on schedule to complete this month.
