**Project History/Schedule:** 

- The Urban Design Commission Granted Initial Approval of these design changes on January 2, 2019.
- The Plan Commission recommended Approval on January 14, 2019.
- The Common Council Approved the associated PD Zoning Amendment on February 5, 2019.


## **Summary of Design Considerations**

In their recommendation, staff requests that the UDC provide references to UDD 7 and feedback on the how proposed changes respond to the January 2, 2019 Initial Approval conditions:

- Redesign the 5th floor windows to be more reflective of the original approval Refer to Item #9 below
- Redesign the 6th floor commercial space to have more windows Refer to Item #10 below
- Provide access for tenants to the 6th floor roof top patio Refer to Item #11 below
- Revisit Fish Hatchery and Park Street elevations and the transition from 5th to 6th floor including the roof alignment of the Fish Hatchery 5th floor to extend to the prow, not cut short at the corner. Refer to Item #12 below

The design team addressed comments as follows: refer to graphics on the back of the second page.


