Kate,

Thank you for sharing the link to the materials that were shared back in December. In looking over the Glacier Hill Park Sun Shelter and Master Plan, I have a few questions about the project. In full disclosure, my property is directly impacted by this plan as it is not only adjacent to the proposed pathway bisecting the park but I would also have a direct view of the proposed sun shelter.

Questions:

- 1. One beautiful aspect of Glacier Hill Park are the old growth trees that run from west to east across the middle of the park. These trees are home to various wild life including a variety of birds, hawks, and pollinators. The proposed path on the west side of the park (Bultman) shows that it will cut directly through these old growth trees, shrubs, and wild life habitat. What impact will the proposed path have on the trees and shrubs that now occupy that space? How many trees and bushes will be removed for this path? What will be added to replenish the park?
- 2. What will the proposed path be made out of? Concrete, blacktop, crushed rock, wooded trail? How wide would this path be?
- 3. If this path is concrete or asphalt, why is it being put through the largest area of green space the area in the park with the most vegetation and trees? What is the need for this path bisecting the park north from south? Every day I see people, usually with their dogs, walk north and south through the park, rarely does anyone walk east/west. They are in the park to enjoy nature.
- 4. If it is concrete or asphalt, what considerations are being made regarding water run-off from the path? I ask this because the area that the proposed pathway would be located (on the west end of the park by Bultman Rd) is lower than the adjacent properties and concrete/asphalt would only encourage more run off into our already taxed storm sewers. There are alternatives to concrete/asphalt like the paths found in the park north of <u>Sandberg woods</u>. These paths are eco-friendly that still allow access to use the spaces but these type of paths do not disrupt the wildlife in the area. These eco-friendly paths require minimal management and allow cost effective use of our green spaces.
- 5. Glacier Hill Park is a massive park with very few trees. Is any funding going to add additional shade trees for future generations to enjoy natural shade and combat climate change? Will any funds be allocated to reintroduce native plants back into the park that could also counter the spreading mustard weed?
- 6. Who will maintain the sun shelter and at what cost to taxpayers? Who will clean up the sun shelter and empty the garbage cans? What are the costs to taxpayers?
- 7. Could the shelter be moved slightly closer to the basketball court/play areas and allow for a very short asphalt path for wheelchair accessibility from Glacier Hill Drive?
- 8. Will the hours of the park change? Will any lighting be added to the park or paths?
- 9. If the path is concrete/asphalt, who will shovel and maintain the proposed pathway in winter or will it be closed in the winter? What are the long term costs to taxpayers for the upkeep and maintenance of the new paths? Will these be part of the parks operating budget or the city?
- 10. Will any signs be added to the west end of the park including park hours?
- 11. On the proposed plan for Glacier Hill Park, it notes "no-mow/prairie" areas on the north end and south ends of the park. Currently, the park maintenance staff mow the entire southern end of the "no mow" prairie" area (Bultman Rd side). Will this area be enhanced and returned to a no-mow/ prairie area?

Could this no-mow/prairie area be increased along the south end of the park to the width that it is on the north end of the park?

I understand that with capital improvement plans funds can be restricted as to how they are used. Our parks are a great asset to our neighborhoods. Glacier Hill Park is one of the reasons I moved into this neighborhood. As we look at the impact of climate change, we can make a difference in our community by increasing the number of trees and plants that aid in the fight against high CO2 levels.

Are you accepting recommendations or proposals on how the funds could be spent differently that would encourage environmentally friendly alternatives to the pathway and sun shelter? What is the cut off date for public input on this project?

I know this is a long list but I care tremendously about the long term impact on our neighborhood. I again want to thank you for your time and look forward to your reply.

I am not a fan of the proposed path that will cut through the tree line in the park to connect to Bultman Drive. I have environmental concerns about that, and am wondering if you (or someone else) can research the following.

When I bought my house at 1102 Southridge Drive, I was told the tree line in my backyard extends across the street and into the park - the same tree line that will be impacted by the path. I was also told that this tree line is protected and I cannot remove any of my trees without state approval (There's no reason I'd ever want to remove my trees, but I was informed of this when I bought my home.).

Please let me know if this is also true of the trees in the park. I looked for documentation of such restrictions and protections in my paperwork that came with the purchase of my home. I suspect if there are protections, this would be on record with the city or state.
