Watercraft Storage


Parks has added 42 additional boat storage spaces at five parks (including a new location of Warner Beach), bringing our total number to 396 canoe/kayak storage spaces. With the addition of these new spaces, our waitlist is still greater than 100, showing a high demand for watercraft storage. Front staff have also implemented a new online application and payment system that will make watercraft storage renewals easier for customers and more efficient for front staff.

Block Parties

Fifty-Two (52) block party applications have been received already this year. Parks typically receives 90 applications each year, with September being the busiest month (about 1/3 of all block parties are held in September).

Shelter Reservations

The summer shelter reservation season is very busy, with many weekends booked solid. The largest number of shelter reservations were made at Olin, Vilas, and John Wall Pavilion at Tenney Park (whole day reservations are counted as 2, half-day reservations as 1).



Picnic shelters are an affordable option for smaller gatherings. The largest number of shelter reservations is at Aldo Leopold Park, which is hosting the 2019 Summer Meals for Kids Program. The most popular picnic shelters include Penn and Esther Beach, which offer restrooms and electricity.

Park Permits

The Front Office Staff processes all daily and annual disc golf, lake access and dog park permits purchased at various City of Madison parks. In the last few years, Parks has kept records of where customers purchase their daily permits in order to better report on the actual use of each park. Annual permit holders are asked which locations are their preferred park sites, but unfortunately we are unable to determine where and how often each location is used. The daily permits purchased clearly indicates our parks are heavily used by one-day users. The following charts show a sample of daily permits purchased to date (by location) in 2019 for Lake Access Permits as well as a comparison of annual dog, disc golf and lake access permits. Please note, the dog park data includes permits sold through the Treasurer's office.
