



## **SMC Report Out: 10/28/2019**

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### **Previously, we reported the following plan that was presented in August 2019.**

1. Identify 3 to 5 members of the community would be interested in working with SMC to make the ideas and impacts of the 100% Renewable Report accessible and connectable to Madison's diverse communities.
2. Engage these 3 to 5 members to offer advice and input while also learning, educating and informing SMC and city departments about plans to actualize and implement the 100% Renewable report.
3. Identify two focus areas out of the following topics → water, transportation, job, youth, health, employment housing
  - Transportation and Housing would be suggested as the recommended focus
4. The input and perspectives of these members will be used to inform next steps of the SMC and the city departments in regards to the 100% Renewable report
5. If we are able to engage and involve 3 to 5 members from the community -- meetings would be held monthly starting in October alternating between in person and video conference calling.

### **Progress Update as of 10/28/2019**

1. We invited 13 members to have a discussion with us about the above agenda.
  - 11 members have responded
  - 2 members have other engagements and are not able to participate
  - we have met with 5 of those 11 members
2. We scheduled another stakeholder meeting for Monday, Nov 4th to be held at Bayview Community Center
  - We have 7 yes, 2 maybe, 1 no to attend
  - we plan to gain cohesion around the topic of engagement and understand what it will take to gain engagement of community around the report and the work to come in the future around the city's intentions for 100% renewable city.
3. The key topics that have been brought forward are as follows:
  - Look at NRT's, TFOGS, Resident Panels...can we align with them
  - Need more clarity around the process ... can we create a "non-tokenised" process to work with engagement.
  - Need to work as a group on "how does the partnership and stakeholder role look and how does that work"
    - **All left the meeting around how to develop this concept**

- goal would be to commit over the next 6 months on this by the current set of stakeholders to find agreement and a path forward
  - put the hold on the topic focus / or chose a focus to help design (more work) (*they are not sure yet*)
    - ex: transportation ... prototype a process around it and then do something on a small scale before it becomes a big process (project)
  - they want a generational partnership and ownership of the issues through the stakeholder process
  - they will look at a framework and see how others have thought about it
- Host meetings at other spaces to get people participating
- The group made inquiry around resource support for this work and they will put together some work around this for consideration.
- There is a will to determine how to develop and drive a meaningful engagement that lifts up community input, inclusion, and gain community perspective for outcomes that benefit the community as much as the city.
