Dark Horse at 10 N. Livingston St.

Dear ALRC members,

Patrick Depula appeared before the Tenney-Lapham Neighborhood Association (TLNA) council on January 9, 2020 to request neighborhood support for an alcohol license for his new restaurant Dark Horse. Patrick Depula also owns Salvatore's Tomato Pies on E. Johnson and another location in Sun Prairie. Dark Horse will be a full service restaurant serving small sharable plates as well as pizza. Depula projects Dark Horse alcohol sales to be 20% of their total business with service hours ending at 10PM Tuesday through Sunday and 12AM Friday and Saturday. While not planning to stay open past these hours, they would like the flexibility to occasionally stay open until 1AM if it coincides with a neighborhood concert's ending.

The TLNA Council voted unanimously to support Patrick Depula and partners request for an alcohol license at Dark Horse under these conditions: No outdoor service will occur past 10pm and no live music will occur in the space. With Depula's good standing in the neighborhood and Dark Horse occupying a space that previously was awarded a liquor license (Sujeo) we think this is a reasonable request.
