# About paper forms, from the website:

### Will I receive a paper form in the mail?

You will have the option to respond online, by phone, or by mail. Initially, most homes will receive a letter between March 12-20 inviting them to go online and complete their census form. If you do not respond online or by phone, you may also receive a paper questionnaire in the mail.

- For areas with low internet access, the Census Bureau will mail a paper questionnaire to households.
- For areas with non-city-style addresses, such as rural route numbers, a census taker will deliver a paper questionnaire to your door in person.
- For areas that are more remote, a census taker will be sent to collect your response in person.
